TWENTY-SECOND DAY

Tuesday, February 20, 2024

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-First Day.

At this time, Senator DeCoite introduced the parents of Jessica Bartlett, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session. Seated in the gallery were Zane Mukai and Carol Mukai, who hailed from Maui.

Senator Chang welcomed his college roommate Evan Lushing and his wife, Cecilia; and Cecilia's mother, who were present in the gallery and visiting from Manhattan, New York. Senator Chang noted that the Lushings had gotten married the previous summer and were on their honeymoon, visiting Oʻahu and the Big Island.

MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

The following messages from the Governor (Gov. Msg. Nos. 621 to 625) were read by the Clerk and were disposed of as follows:

Gov. Msg. No. 621, informing the Senate that on February 16, 2024, the Governor withdrew the nomination of BENJAMIN KUDO to the Mauna Kea Stewardship and Oversight Authority, under Gov. Msg. No. 587, from consideration by the Senate, was placed on file.

In compliance with Gov. Msg. No. 621, the nomination listed under Gov. Msg. No. 587 was returned.

Senator Dela Cruz moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2732 be adopted and S.B. No. 2381, S.D. 2, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator Moriwaki.

Senator Rhoads rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"This bill has the potential for reducing the influence of special-interest money significantly because it provides a full public financing option for candidates who wish to run for office and requires a lot of grassroots support to get the money to run for office, but it does allow people who don't come from financial backgrounds where they're capable of raising a lot of money a chance also. So I hope my colleagues will support this; I think it could potentially be a very important addition to our campaign finance law. Mahalo."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2732 was adopted and S.B. No. 2381, S.D. 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC FINANCING FOR CANDIDATES TO ELECTED OFFICE," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 25. Noes, none.

At this time, Senator Dela Cruz announced that the Committee on Ways and Means would reconvene its informational briefing at noon.

Senator Kim rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"I'd like to request that we adjourn on a rising moment of silence for Emme Tomimbang, who passed away unexpectedly while having heart surgery. Emme was a very active and renowned member of our community and a Filipino leader, and we will miss her dearly. Thank you."

The Chair announced that there would be a leadership meeting immediately following adjournment. The Chair clarified that certain members of leadership would be attending the Ways and Means briefing instead. The Chair then expressed the Senate's commitment to solving the issues faced by residents impacted by the Maui fires.

ADJOURNMENT

At 11:43 a.m., on motion by Senator Wakai, seconded by Senator DeCoite and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 a.m., Wednesday, February 21, 2024, on a rising vote, observing a moment of silence in recognition of the contributions made to the community by Emme Tomimbang, who had passed away the previous day.
