#### TWENTY-THIRD DAY

### Wednesday, February 21, 2024

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 11:32 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Ihara and Keohokalole who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Second Day.

At this time, Senator Shimabukuro introduced Duane DeSoto, a constituent and World Longboard champion, who was seated in the gallery.

Senator DeCoite recognized Melissa Pavlicek. Accompanying her in the gallery was Sam Lopez from the Building Owners and Managers Association in Washington, D.C., who was visiting the Capitol for the first time.

Senator Wakai announced that it was Water Safety Day at the Capitol and encouraged the members to visit the displays on the fourth floor. Senator Wakai then welcomed Water Safety Day participants who were present in the gallery: Kalani Vierra and Kirsten Hermstad of the Hawaiian Lifeguard Association; president Shirley De Rego and Ryder Sansano of the Alex & Duke De Rego Foundation; Jessamy Town Hornor, coordinator of the Hawai'i Water Safety Coalition; and founder and chief executive officer Duane DeSoto and chief operations officer Matt Kauwe of Nā Kama Kai.

Senator Lee welcomed Andrew McClean, a friend and former state legislator from Maine. Accompanying him in the gallery were his dad, David; David's partner, Mary; and his uncle and aunt John and Debbie.
