Thursday, March 28, 2024

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 11:40 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator Richards who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fortieth Day.
