

FORTY-SECOND DAY

Monday, April 1, 2024

The Senate of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai‘i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 11:31 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Ihara and San Buenaventura who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-First Day.

At this time, Senator Aquino recognized and congratulated the Waipahu High School football team on their Division I state football championship, and presented the following remarks:

“Today the Senate is honoring the Waipahu High School varsity football team for winning the Hawai‘i State Division I football championship this past November. As senators, we typically receive requests to acknowledge various team sports and other highly deserving individuals and organizations to recognize their hard work and achievements. This particular team and their coaching staff have special distinction due to the challenges they overcame to become champions.

“Despite starting their season with three consecutive losses; despite injuries, coaching changes, among others, they remained focused. They persevered and were committed to improvement. As the season progressed, they persevered, securing crucial victories against Radford, Wai‘anae, Castle, Kailua, Leilehua, Farrington, and, finally, a triumphant win over the defending champions, Konawaena High School, in the state football championship.

“Coach Bryson Carvalho, please stand. Since becoming head coach in 2015, coach Bryson Carvalho has been the head coach and has led Waipahu High School to multiple state championships, showing commitment to player growth and developing quality young men. With him, and please stand when your name is called: assistant coach Lehua Saturnio, Caleb Lauifi, Arjay Kelemete, Tai Aipia Barrett, and Eric Moananu. And in the gallery, we wanted to introduce a very special person: the athletic director, Stacie Nii. If she’s here, please stand. Give her a hand, everyone. Thank you. Congratulations; you may be seated. Thank you for your hard work.

“I now yield the floor to Senator Wakai.”

Senator Wakai rose to present the following remarks:

“You know, all of us in Hawai‘i know that Hawai‘i has only two seasons: It’s football season and non-football season. Congratulations to the Waipahu Marauders for taking the championship during the football season. There are several members of the coaching staff and the remaining members of this championship team are in the gallery. When I call your names, if you could please stand. We have assistant coach Andrew Stewart. He’s joined by assistant coach Nathaniel Timoteo and the rest of the members of the Division I state championship Waipahu Marauder football team—please rise.
