Thursday, January 30, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai‘i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Dela Cruz, Fevella, and Richards who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Eighth Day.

At this time, Senator San Buenaventura welcomed Judge Robert Kim, administrative judge for the Third Circuit, who was seated in the gallery.

Senator DeCoite introduced members of her staff who were present in the gallery: Jessie Kalahui, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate’s floor session; office manager Eseta Malufau; legislative aide Richard Oshiro; and Thomas Gomes.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
