

## TWENTY-EIGHTH DAY

## Monday, March 10, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:44 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Fevella, Ihara, Keohokalole, McKelvey, and Richards who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Seventh Day.

At this time, Senator Chang introduced Clayton "Uncle Clay" Chang and Bronson Chang, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session. Senator Chang noted that the Changs were the former proprietors of Uncle Clay's House of Pure Aloha, which had been a community institution in East Honolulu for many years. They were joined in the gallery by supporters and friends, including Roger Epstein. Senator Chang requested that the names of all other supporters and friends of the Changs be entered into the Journal, and the Chair so ordered.

“PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVII, SECTION 3 OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION TO SPECIFY THAT THE STANDARD FOR VOTER APPROVAL OF A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY THE LEGISLATURE IS A MAJORITY OF ALL THE VOTES TALLIED UPON THE QUESTION.”
