Wednesday, March 12, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Fevella and McKelvey who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Ninth Day.

At this time, Senator Wakai introduced Fee Jacobsen, secretary of the South Dakota Senate from 1987 to 1998. Joining Ms. Jacobsen in the gallery was her grandson Fauzy Farghali. Senator Wakai then welcomed the CEO, staff, and students from the YMCA of Honolulu, Hawai'i Island, and Maui who were champions of youth mental health. Senator Wakai explained that there had been an increase in depression and anxiety among Hawai'i's youth, with an estimated 10,000 between the ages of 12 and 17 suffering from depression but with nearly 69 percent not receiving any type of care. Senator Wakai noted that the YMCA program offered stress management tools, social support, and physical-wellness activities to more than 4,000 children. Joining the group in the gallery were students from Dole Middle School, located in Senator Kim's district.

Gov. Msg. No. 725, submitting for consideration and confirmation, the nomination of SCOTT K.D. SHISHIDO as Judge of the Circuit Court of the Third Circuit (island of Hawai'i), for a term of ten years, was referred to the Committee on Judiciary.
