

THIRTY-SECOND DAY

Friday, March 14, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:32 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Fukunaga, McKelvey, and Richards who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-First Day.
