The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:31 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

Senator San Buenaventura welcomed Dan Haire, president and CEO of Navian, a nonprofit organization that provided hospice, palliative, and kupuna care.
