

## FIFTIETH DAY

## Monday, April 14, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator Fevella who was excused.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Ninth Day.

At this time, Senator McKelvey introduced Hawai'i Poet Laureate Brandy Nālani McDougall, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session. Joining her in the gallery were members of Senator McKelvey's staff: office manager and "right hand" Wendee Wilson, "left hand" Beth MacKenzie, committee clerk Kamana Levy, and assistant committee clerk Kauila Pratt.

Senator San Buenaventura acknowledged Daintry Bartoldus and Che Silvert, who were present in the gallery on behalf of individuals to be confirmed that day to serve on the State Council on Developmental Disabilities.
