

## TWENTIETH DAY

## Friday, February 14, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators DeCoite and Gabbard who were excused.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Nineteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Keohokalole introduced members of his staff who were seated in the gallery: office manager Jules Peleiholani; committee clerk Jaymee Weisberg; assistant committee clerk Kiera Williams; staff attorney Kurt Klein; legislative researcher Charles Jonsson; intern Katie Anderson; and intern Josslyn Rose, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session.

Senator Lee recognized the enduring contributions of Bob Marley and the Marley 'ohana and presented the following remarks:

"It's an honor and a privilege to stand before you today as we gather to celebrate and reflect on the life and legacy of one of the most profound cultural figures of the 20th century: Bob Marley, a man whose music transcended borders and a voice that echoed the dreams and struggles of millions and whose impact on the world and here in Hawai'i continues to resonate today.

"Bob Marley was born on February 6, 1945, in Nine Mile, Jamaica, and it is from this small, humble town that the seeds of a global movement were sown. Through their musical genius, he and the members of the Wailers came together to share a message of love, peace, unity, and an unwavering belief in justice and freedom. They went on to become a symbol of resistance, unity, and hope for millions around the world, and his contribution to society cannot be measured simply by record sales, accolades, awards (though they have been many) but rather by the immense cultural shift he helped foster—one that challenged oppression, injustice, and the exploitation of the marginalized across all continents.

"At the heart of Bob Marley's music was his faith and Rastafarian values of love and righteousness, but also it was a commitment to social and political justice. Tracks like 'War,' 'One Love,' and 'Get Up, Stand Up' continue to be anthems for so many around the world, resonating with anyone who has ever felt the sting of inequality or the weight of oppression. Marley's words were a call to action reminding us that we must stand up for our rights not only for ourselves but for each other.

"Beyond his activism, Marley had an extraordinary ability to connect with people. His message was simple but powerful: Love, respect, and compassion are the pillars of humanity. His belief in the power of music to heal, unite, and uplift spirits was evident in everything he did. His message of peace and love often expressed through timeless lyrics is something that continues to inspire and uplift so many of us today. His commitment to living authentically, embracing his roots, and expressing truth regardless of adversity is a model for anyone seeking to make a meaningful impact on themselves, those around them, and the broader world.

"As we reflect today on that legacy, let us remember the words of Bob Marley himself: 'In this bright future you can't forget your past.' His contribution to society for so many years serves as a reminder that we are all part of a greater collective journey. Bob Marley's music, his activism, and his vision for a

better world continue to inspire us, urging us to be brave in the face of injustice; to love unconditionally; and to never stop fighting for our mental, spiritual, and physical freedom.

"Mr. President, I'd like to turn it over to the senator from Kailua and Kāne'ohe."

Senator Keohokalole rose to present the following remarks:

"In 1979, Bob Marley and the Wailers came to Hawai'i on tour to perform at the Waikiki Shell and the Lahaina Civic Center. During his time here, Marley connected deeply with the people and culture of the islands, fostering a cultural exchange that helped solidify reggae as a central influence on Hawaiian music. His music, with its themes of freedom and resistance, resonated strongly with the local population at the time, who share a history of colonial struggle and the preservation of the Hawaiian culture. The fusion of reggae with Hawaiian traditions led to a unique evolution of both genres, with Hawaiian musicians incorporating reggae rhythms and styles into their own sound. Emerging on the heels of this visit was Jawaiian music, which is a '90s term; now we just call it 'local music.' Artists such as Fiji, Kapena, and the late Israel Kamakawiwo'ole helped define the genre, blending the laid-back, melodic style of reggae with Hawaiian instruments and vocal harmonies. The lyrics often focus on themes of love, unity, spirituality, and island life, making it deeply relatable to us local listeners.

"Today, our local music that Bob Marley helped shape has grown beyond Hawai'i, gaining popularity on the U.S. continent in states like California and even internationally, inspiring artists like the iconic J Boog, who is here with us in the gallery. Its distinct sound, which incorporates steel guitars, ukuleles, and reggae beats, has created a bridge between cultures, allowing reggae's positive messages of peace and resilience to flourish within the Hawaiian context. Our island music culture is just one example of the power of Bob Marley's positive influence on the world and the ability of the arts to transcend differences and bring people together.

"Reggae and local music continue to thrive in Hawai'i, with wonderful events like Hawai'i Fest drawing locals and visitors alike. Through its soulful rhythms and messages, reggae has become an essential part of Hawai'i's spirit, an enduring reminder of the power of music to bridge cultures and inspire change. The legacy of Bob Marley alongside the aloha spirit remains a beacon of unity and peace.

"Thank you, Mr. President. I now yield to the senator from Puna."

Senator San Buenaventura rose to present the following remarks:

"I have the honor today of introducing the Marley family. With us here today, we are honored to welcome members of the Marley family, each of whom carries forward the legacy of the great Bob Marley in their own unique way.

"Ky-Mani Marley, could you please stand and remain standing? (Hold your applause until I've introduced everyone; thank you.) Ky-Mani Marley is a dynamic force in music. He blends reggae, hip hop, and R&B, crafting a sound that is both innovative and deeply rooted in his heritage. His lyrics reflect resilience, love, and social consciousness, and his artistry extends beyond music into acting, making him a true storyteller at heart.

"And we also have Mystic Marley (please stand), a granddaughter of Bob Marley. She's a rising star in a fresh and

soulful voice. She seamlessly fuses reggae, soul, and R&B while infusing her work with the same passion and depth that defined her family's legacy. Inspired by legends like Nina Simone and Alicia Keys, Mystic is not just carrying on a name—she is forging her own powerful path, spreading messages of unity, peace, and empowerment.

“Julian Marley (please stand), a true son of reggae, continues to honor his father's mission through his own extraordinary musical journey. A skilled multi-instrumentalist, his fusion of reggae, rock, and hip-hop has captivated audiences worldwide. His Grammy-winning album, *Colors of Royal*, is a testament to his dedication to the art form, proving that the Marley legacy is not just one of the past but of the future as well.

“And while music is at the heart of the Marley name, we also recognize Nyah Marley (please stand), whose presence is a reminder that the strength of a legacy is not only in performance but in the unity of family. She stands alongside her relatives as a vital part of this moment, representing the deep roots and shared spirit that bind them all.

“Together, the Marley family continues to inspire music, carrying forward Bob Marley's vision of love, justice, and cultural pride. Their contributions remind us that this message is still alive and thriving, reaching new generations around the world. Thank you for being with us today, and in my district of Puna, you can always hear Marley music. Thank you very much, and welcome to the Senate.”

The Chair announced that the honorees would be greeted on the Senate floor immediately following adjournment.
