

## THIRTY-SEVENTH DAY

Friday, March 21, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:32 a.m. with Senator Ihara in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Kouchi and Lee who were excused.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator Hashimoto introduced Ethan Yang, from Kaiser High School, who had been honored on the Senate floor earlier that week and was supporting his fellow Senate Youth delegate. Accompanying him in the gallery was Tory Nakata, a staff member in Senator Hashimoto's office.

Senator Kidani congratulated and recognized LifeSmarts winners and a Senate Youth delegate and presented the following remarks:

"Today is our fifth and final celebration of Education Week 2025, and I am excited to recognize the top teams of the annual LifeSmarts consumer education competition. LifeSmarts is a game show-style contest which tests students on their knowledge of personal finance, health and safety, the environment, technology, and consumer rights and responsibilities. The LifeSmarts program, run by the National Consumers League, is sponsored in Hawai'i by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Business Registration and Insurance Division in partnership with the Hawaii Credit Union League.

"On behalf of Senate President, I would like to introduce the honorees who reside in District 10.

"Three O'ahu schools took top honors in the 21st annual statewide competition, and two teams are joining us here today.

"In the statewide final hosted at the Neil Blaisdell Center in Honolulu, 'Iolani School emerged victorious. Thank you.

"I now yield the floor to Senator Chang."

Senator Hashimoto rose to present the following remarks:

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1208 (Gov. Msg. No. 644):

Senator Elefante moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1208 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Wakai and carried.

Senator Elefante then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of STEPHEN LOGAN to the Department of Defense (position amended to Adjutant General by Gov. Msg. No. 648), term to expire December 7, 2026, seconded by Senator Wakai.

Senator Elefante rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

"Mr. President, I'd like to voice my support for G.M. 644 for Major General Stephen Logan on the position of adjutant general for the State of Hawai'i Department of Defense.

"Major General Logan graduated from Chaminade University of Honolulu with an emphasis in criminal justice and received a master's degree from the U.S. Army War College with a focus on strategic studies. Mr. Logan began his career at the City and County of Honolulu as a patrol officer and rising to the ranks of lieutenant for 22 years.

"In addition, Major General Logan has ascended through the ranks within the Department of Defense, serving in various capacities such as commander, 103rd Troop Command; deputy infantry brigade combat team commander; state army aviation officer; brigade commander; deputy United States property and fiscal officer for Hawai'i; command administrative officer/chief of staff; assistant adjutant general; deputy adjutant general; and in his current role as the adjutant general, or also known as the TAG.

"His long-standing history of military experience speaks volumes toward his character and expertise as a collaborative leader. Mr. Logan's wealth of well-rounded knowledge of disaster management, fiscal responsibility, and logistical analysis make Major General Logan exceptionally qualified for the role of adjutant general for the state of Hawai'i.

"After reviewing testimony in unanimous support from the Committee on Public Safety and Military Affairs, your committee recommends to advise and consent for Major General Logan to be confirmed as the adjutant general for the state of Hawai'i. Thank you, Mr. President."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

At this time, Senator Elefante introduced Adjutant General Stephen Logan, who was seated in the gallery with his wife, Darcie Logan; his daughter Naiya Logan and her partner, Nui Gier; his brother Honolulu Police Department Chief Joe Logan; his father-in-law, retired major Robert Imose; his brother-in-law Daryl Imose and his wife, Sue Imose; and close friends Jay and Bernie Yano. Also present in the gallery were former adjutant general and retired major general Kenneth S. Hara and his wife,

Myoung; Brigadier General Mallory; Brigadier General Ross; Colonel Hogsten; Colonel Nagatani; Colonel Cullens; Colonel Inigo; Command Sergeant Major Kunalae; Lieutenant Colonel Boone; Lieutenant Colonel Tudel; Brigadier General Sills; members of the Hawai'i Army National Guard; and Department of Defense staff.

The Chair welcomed longtime friend Robert Imose, who was seated in the gallery.

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1209 (Gov. Msg. No. 645):

Senator Elefante moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1209 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Wakai and carried.

Senator Elefante then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of MIKE LAMBERT to the Department of Law Enforcement (position amended to Director by Gov. Msg. No. 650), term to expire December 7, 2026, seconded by Senator Wakai.

Senator Elefante rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

“Mr. President, I’d like to voice my support for G.M. 645, Major Mike Lambert, on the position of the director of the Department of Law Enforcement. Mr. Lambert is a graduate of the University of Hawai’i – West O’ahu, majoring in public administration with a concentration in justice administration. After graduation, Mr. Lambert started his law enforcement career with the Honolulu Police Department, rising up the ranks from patrol officer to major. Mr. Lambert’s long history over two decades of outstanding dedication and leadership demonstrates his ability to perform in the role of director for the Department of Law Enforcement with excellence and commitment.

“After reviewing his testimony in unanimous support, the Committee on Public Safety and Military Affairs recommends to advise and consent for Major Mike Lambert to be confirmed as the director of Law Enforcement for the state of Hawai’i. Thank you.”

Senator Moriwaki rose to speak in strong support of the nominee as follows:

“I first started working with Major Lambert when the homeless problem was rampant in my district with blue tarps everywhere: Kaka’ako, Waikiki, McCully. Today, while we still have homeless in our district, no more large encampments. I credit Major Lambert’s leadership, commitment to public safety and public service, and his knowledge and experience in bringing people and agencies together for bringing down those numbers. He brought us HONU, the city police department at the helm of providing temporary shelters where homeless can get a shower and connect to services and housing. And he took that knowledge to train officers in crisis intervention and worked to give them the support from government and community agencies like Institute for Human Services and the Hawai’i Health & Harm Reduction Center. They moved homeless to better places.

“Another example of his ‘get it done’ leadership and action and his impact: As commander of Narcotics/Vice Division, he again demonstrated leadership and commitment to end an after-hours club that had been operating gambling, drugs, and prostitution in our district for years, unable to be broken. In a few months of Mike being assigned to the division, the clubhouse was taken down.

“Colleagues, Major Lambert will be a valuable addition to our state’s public safety program. I wholeheartedly endorse his appointment. Thank you.”

Senator Fevella rose to speak in strong support of the nominee as follows:

“I had the privilege in working with Major Lambert in our community in District 8, especially on the west side. When he came into the community, we had plenty problems. We still have problems in our districts. But one of them was our game rooms, and, you know, I didn’t want him to be head of Law Enforcement, and he knows. Not because I don’t like him—I think that we’re going to be losing a great officer in District 8 who had a lot of momentum in going not only with the gambling but with the houseless community and just trying to get more crime off the streets. I guess you can say that. But I have confidence in him that he’s gonna continue the great works that he’s doing—that he did with HPD—and doing that with the Law Enforcement department. I was a big supporter of the Law Enforcement because we needed not to take over HPD but to have another force to help assist with our issues that we having all around the state. So, with his addition to having a background of being an HPD officer (I know a lot of people saying that they never like HPD be part of Law Enforcement shared that with him), but having a background in law enforcement and the great things that he did in our communities—all of our communities as Senator Moriwaki said—I think we have confidence in him that he’s gonna do a great job, and I support his efforts all the way. Thank you, Senate President.”

Senator DeCorte rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

“Senate President and colleagues, I’m honored to support the nomination of Mike Lambert. On the Wai’anae Coast, he has been instrumental when it comes to HPD in helping us with ‘boots on the ground’ efforts. It was his efforts that led the crackdown on major game rooms on the Wai’anae Coast: We went from 25 game rooms to 9 game rooms within a matter of nine months, which is incredibly impressive. So he has been a man not just of integrity but somebody who will put actions behind his words. In the short time that he has been with the Department of Law Enforcement, he has assured us that the Department of Law Enforcement will be able to, again, be boots on the grounds when it comes to helping us to crack down on ag crimes and especially extra enforcement in our schools.

“And so I’m very excited about this nomination. I’m excited to work with him and the Department of Law Enforcement in addition to HPD to help us to bring the enforcement that we need on the Wai’anae Coast—as everyone knows, we are lacking enforcement. So I’m excited for his ambition, his passion, and also his team with Deputy Director Jared Redulla and just an amazing fleet of just incredible men that are willing to put their boots to the ground and put their actions on the Wai’anae Coast to help us in that effort. So I just wanted to extend my appreciation, my congratulations, and thank you, Mike Lambert and his family, for saying ‘yes’ to this. Mahalo, thank you.”

Senator Richards rose to speak in strong support of the nominee as follows:

“Mike came out of the blocks hard and quick when it comes to the agricultural crimes and going after that. We as a body are pushing hard toward supporting agriculture by enforcing the laws that govern the function of agriculture and specifically protecting agriculture. Mr. Lambert came out in strong support, and I’ve met with him several times, and I really look forward to working with he and his entire staff as we go forward.”

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

At this time, Senator Keohokalole introduced two special and influential constituents. Seated in the gallery were his kids Emma Keohokalole and Lenox Keohokalole, who were on spring break.

Senator San Buenaventura reminded her colleagues that the annual YWCA clothing drive would take place from March 31st to April 4th. Senator San Buenaventura encouraged the donation of new or gently used professional attire to support individuals in need as they entered the workforce and noted that donations could be dropped off in her office in Room 213 or in Representative Gregg Takayama's office in Room 404.

Senator Gabbard read a letter from Representative Gene Ward in which Representative Ward discussed his impending resignation from the Hawai'i House of Representatives because of health issues and wished his colleagues well.

Senator Kanuha rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Members and guests, can we all recognize and mahalo Senate Vice President and her staff for putting on an amazing Education Week?"
