

## FORTY-THIRD DAY

**Tuesday, April 1, 2025**

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:38 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senator DeCoite who was excused.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Second Day.

At this time, Senator Kanuha rose and stated:

"Mr. President, colleagues, and honored guests: Today, we have the distinct honor of welcoming the exceptional student-athletes of the boys and girls wrestling teams of Kamehameha Schools – Kapālāma, who have brought pride and glory to their school and community by capturing state championship titles.

"At this time, I would like to yield to the senator from District 14, who represents this area and will introduce these remarkable champions."

Senator Kim congratulated the Kamehameha Schools – Kapālāma wrestling team on their boys' team and girls' individual state titles and presented the following remarks:

"Mr. President, let me just first say 'i mua Kamehameha!' As the mom of a Kamehameha Schools alumnus who was a lifer, and he also played sports at Kamehameha, I'm really proud to stand up and to recognize the outstanding boys and girls teams of Kamehameha Schools – Kapālāma for their remarkable achievements in the 2024 state wrestling championships. These athletes have demonstrated unparalleled dedication, discipline, and resilience—qualities that have not only propelled them to victory but also exemplify the values instilled by their school, coaches, and community.

"I am excited to recognize first the Wahine Warriors wrestling team, whose performance this year was nothing short of extraordinary. I am proud to share that this talented team produced not just one, not two, but three individual state champions, each embodying the Warrior spirit and commitment to excellence. First, Jax Realin. Jax is a senior who captured her third state title. Then we have Rylie Nishida. Rylie, who is also a senior, who captured her second title. And she's also just a freshman, I might say. And Auriana Wakinekona, who won her first state title. Okay, let me correct that; let me correct that. Auriana is the freshman. Also, I want to congratulate all of you, ladies. You've made your school, your families, and your community proud.

"Now, I'm equally proud to introduce the boys wrestling team, who displayed unmatched grit, determination, and resilience to earn the 2024 boys championship title. Their dominating performance at the state championship match is a testament to their dedication and Warrior spirit. First, head coach David William Keike Chew (if you will stand to be recognized, Coach). And then we have co-captain Noah McKenzie; Noah, please stand to be recognized. And co-captain Ramsey Nishida, who's the twin brother of Rylie Nishida, so it runs in the family.

"And I'd like the rest of the team sitting up in the gallery, if you will all please rise to be recognized for your hard work and perseverance?"

"Finally, Mr. President, none of this success would have been possible without the leadership and guidance of the dedicated team of Warrior assistant coaches who inspired and mentored and molded these athletes into champions both on and off the

court, so a special mahalo goes to them. And also, to the parents of all of these athletes—we do have a couple of them in our audience—if you will please stand and be recognized.

"And, Mr. President, may I submit the rest of the names so that they can be entered into the Journal?"

"And I now pass this over back to our Majority Leader."

The Chair having so ordered, the names read as follows:

Senator Kanuha rose and stated:

"It is often said that champions are made, not born, and nowhere has this been more evident than in the journey of these Warriors. With the unwavering support of their athletic department, fellow students, administrators, proud parents, and all those who have guided and supported them, these student-athletes have proven themselves to be true champions in every sense of the word. Congratulations."

The Chair announced that the honorees would be greeted on the Senate floor immediately following adjournment.
