

## FORTY-SIXTH DAY

## Friday, April 4, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:44 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Fukunaga observed that it was always exciting to celebrate the UH Rainbows and their baseball team. Senator Fukunaga then introduced Makiki condo constituent Lari Yasui, who was joined in the gallery by Nancy Bauer, who was present to watch her grandson play in that week's tournament.

The Chair clarified that Ms. Bauer's grandson was on the California State University, Long Beach, team. The Chair noted that when the guests had stopped by his office, he had explained that they would not be cheering for Ms. Bauer's grandson the coming weekend but wished him nothing but the best afterward.

Senator Kidani acknowledged Mililani High School Principal Fred Murphy, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session. Senator Kidani explained that Principal Murphy had served as a senator and chairman of the UH Student Senate Caucus while pursuing his bachelor's degree in secondary education and had also served as a legislative intern in 1992 to then-senator Malama Solomon. Senator Kidani noted that Principal Murphy had named the state's National Distinguished Principal of the Year by the Hawaii Association of Secondary School Administrators in 2019. Joining Principal Murphy in the gallery were his sons, Kellen Murphy, a graduate of Mililani High School and sophomore at the California State Polytechnic University Pomona; and Evan Murphy, a senior at Mililani High School.

He was 82 years old."

"Mr. President, on behalf of myself, Senator Hashimoto, and Senator McKelvey, I would like to thank Principal Murphy as well as the senator from District 17 and District 18. During the time of COVID, they put together a massive drive for the people of Lahaina and Upcountry Kula. So, I just wanted to give you my aloha, mahalo on behalf of the people of Maui and more so the people of Lahaina, so thank you."

On behalf of herself and Senator Kidani, Senator DeCoite then announced that the Women's Legislative Caucus held an annual Easter basket drive for donations to organizations that helped women and children in need. Senator DeCoite explained that members would have a say on which of their colleagues would serve as the Easter bunny and the Easter chick. Senator DeCoite observed that most of the members had submitted their ballots for the Easter chick and reminded those with outstanding ballots to vote and return the ballots to her office by Tuesday, April 8th. Senator DeCoite invited the members to join the Women's Legislative Caucus with their Easter basket donations on Friday, April 11th, immediately following adjournment of the House of Representatives floor session, on the Rotunda level.

Senator Gabbard rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“Mr. President, colleagues, staff, and guests: I, too, would like to say a few words about my friend and colleague Representative Gene Ward, who, as was mentioned, left his 82-year-old body this morning. On a personal level, Gene and I were both elected in November 2006, and from the start, we developed a strong mutual respect. Over the years we served together, we talked story often and shared a common commitment to serving the people of Hawai‘i. What stood out most about Gene was how deeply connected he was to his community: He listened to his constituents; he knew their concerns, and he worked tirelessly to represent them with heart and integrity. He was also someone who cared deeply about Hawai‘i’s culture. Whether he was advocating for Native Hawaiian issues or protecting our values, Gene brought sincerity and a strong moral compass to everything he did. And no matter what side of the aisle he was on, Gene was fearless. He wasn’t afraid to stand alone if he believed it was the right thing to do, and he did it with grace. Gene’s presence at the Capitol will truly be missed. He was someone you could always count on to speak his mind, ask the tough questions, and bring a thoughtful perspective to the floor. Whether you agreed with him or not, you knew where he stood, and you knew that he cared. Gene lived a life of service, and his legacy will continue in the people and causes that he championed. And so, to the Ward ‘ohana: Please know that you have our deepest aloha and prayers. Mahalo.”

Senator DeCorte rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“I would also like to share with regards to Representative Gene Ward, and as we honor the life and legacy of Representative Ward, his passing leaves a void in the very heart of our Native Hawaiian people. For decades, Rep. Ward stood on the House floor not only for his glory but for our lāhui, whose voices often went unheard. In his book *Broken Promises*, he refers to Hawaiians by stating, ‘Our population is decreasing and the net out-migration has reached crisis levels. The state is slowly bleeding out of its best and its brightest.’ This was not just about numbers; for Rep. Ward, this was personal. He went on by saying in his book, ‘Let this be a wake-up call. We need to put policies in place that reverse this trend, or we will lose an entire generation.’ Representative Gene Ward was more than a legislator—he was an advocate for our lāhui. He didn’t just fight for numbers in a report or dots on a map—he fought for our people. He fought for the right of Native Hawaiians to live on their lands; to raise their children in the same valleys, to fish the same shores, to speak the same language, and to practice the same traditions, not from a distance, not from the continent, not in exile, but right here in our home of Hawai‘i. Mahalo nui, Representative Ward. Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, has welcomed you into the gates of Heaven, saying, ‘Well done, good and faithful servant.’ Mahalo.”

Senator Lee rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“I was going to insert comments, but I realized, during announcements, that’s probably not something appropriate to do, so I’ll just say very briefly, in addition to the comments from our colleagues today about Representative Ward, it has been truly an honor the last 17 years to serve alongside. And he’s truly been a person that kinda opened my eyes because, for 12 years, I served alongside him in the House in an adjacent district and knew he was energetic and very, very active in the community. But it was only when I actually came to the Senate and overlapped most of his district that I suddenly got invites on a regular basis that I could not simply keep up with for all the things in the community that he was engaged in. And I really want to just share that I don’t think there’s anything and anyone

out there that I’ve met that has matched that level of engagement with the community. And the bar he set is high—which I surely will never reach—but appreciate the tutoring and, I think, eye-opening strategies and engagement that he’s really provided me through a new lens here in the Senate. So, with that, he will surely be missed by our community, and wish his family the best.”

Senator Fevella rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“You know, for me, our relationship was pretty strong from the beginning when I came into this building. He was very proud of his book *Broken Promises*. He wanted to let me know that he was on our side, if you could say that. But I didn’t understand Gene as well as a lot of people because, truly, I thought he was strange, talking to me about my people and the struggles. If anybody was an honorary Hawaiian, it was Representative Gene Ward. He loved our people like he was one Hawaiian. Half the discussions that we had, numerous of discussions, and it seemed like with Senator Lee, invited me—you know, even though I live right down the road (‘Ewa Beach)—constantly to come and engage his community, whether it was about Hawaiian issues, about just issues at the time that, again, when I came to this building, I didn’t know I had. And the position that I had when it came to minority leader, floor leader—all these accolades that didn’t mean nothing to me in ‘Ewa Beach that I just wanted to serve my community. But he was always proud for having me as a local boy from ‘Ewa Beach, being with him, talking with him, and eating with him, and having a lot of discussions.”

“But my relationship with Gene Ward goes a little bit back before this square building. When I was a refuse inspector for the City and County of Honolulu, I had a complaint of bulky items being brought out a little early. So, lo and behold, I was there to write up my report, and this guy came out of nowhere with his 1960s Woodstock clothes and told me, ‘What are you doing here?’ I said, ‘This guy have his bulky items out too early.’ I didn’t recognize him at first. He said, ‘Well, let me help you because these guys are good people. They probably didn’t know, so don’t cite them.’ So the conversation I had with him, lo and behold, he wen’ help me—even though I did most of the work—he wen’ help me put ‘em on. But then he had another question; he said, ‘I have some stuff in my garage. You think you could help me take this, too?’ And I did, not knowing that I was gonna serve with him in this square building going forward. And it was just one great relationship because that guy, seriously, you know, I see his passion in the House all the time, and like a lot of our colleagues said, he stands alone. But one thing that he never, never put down and never let anybody know: his love for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and his family. So, again, my love and aloha to Gene Ward and his family. He will be truly missed. Love and aloha to him. Thank you, Senate President.”

Senator McKelvey rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“Gene Ward, representative, was a member of our class of 2006, so I feel compelled to just say a few words from that. On behalf of myself and my good friend over here, Senator Rhoads, our first foray into political public life came with him as our new freshmen because he had been there before. And right from the word go, everything that was said was so true, and through the years, he became a sparring partner of mine. We actually looked forward to floor sessions, and the Senate has been relieved of that because of the fact that he loved debate—the marketplace of free ideas was his big thing. So, we would look forward to seeing each other and me calling him out for not reading the bill and him standing up and saying that we were being duplicitous and not standing up for the people of Hawai‘i and all the great, colorful things that he would say. But to you,

Gene, my friend, my former sparring partner, and classmate of 2006, aloha 'oe."
