Tuesday, April 8, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 10:07 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator DeCorte welcomed guests who were part of the Wai'anae High School Searider culinary program, which had been established 11 years prior and would be participating in a national competition the following summer. Seated in the gallery were program instructor Nicole Antonio-Ferriman; college intern Kanoa Gouveia; and Wai'anae High School seniors Mahealani McDonald and Karl Laguatan and juniors Kirsten Magsayo and Reiny-Leigh Nahulu. Senator DeCorte then recognized constituents from the Wai'anae Coast as well as a Makakilo resident.

- (1) Act as a fiduciary and trustee of public moneys;
- (2) Remain independent from any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, contractor, or business;
- (3) Act only in the public interest;
- (4) Abide by the statutes and administrative rules relating to public procurement;
- (5) Identify and maximize efficiencies in the public procurement process;
- (6) Encourage economic competition by:
 - (A) Ensuring that all persons are afforded an equal opportunity to compete in a fair and open environment; and
 - (B) Researching innovative goods and services to meet the public’s needs;
- (7) Avoid the intent and appearance of unethical behavior;
- (8) Avoid social interactions with any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, contractor, business, or other interested parties during the procurement process;
- (9) Maintain confidentiality in a manner that ensures a fair procurement process;
- (10) Remain impartial in dealings with any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, contractor, business, or other interested parties; and
- (11) Identify and eliminate any conflicts of interest.

(b) Any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, [F]contractor[F], or business taking part in the conduct of public procurement, shall act in good faith to practice purchasing ethics, and when applicable, display business integrity as a responsible offeror through the public procurement process, including but not limited to the following:

- (1) Avoiding the intent and appearance of unethical behavior or business practices;
- (2) Refraining from any activity that would create the appearance of impropriety or conflicts of personal interest and the interests of the State or counties;
- (3) Identifying and eliminating any conflicts of interest; and
- (4) Ensuring that all persons are afforded an equal opportunity to compete in a fair and open environment.

(c) All parties involved in the negotiation, performance, or administration of state contracts shall act in good faith.

(d) Governmental bodies and public employees shall not procure services for project management through non-governmental third-party contracts; provided that this subsection shall not apply to the procurement of independent verification and validation contracts for information technology services if approved by the agency’s respective chief procurement officer, as provided under section 103D-203.”

SECTION 2. House Bill No. 1155, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, is amended by amending section 2 to read as follows:

“SECTION 2. Section 103D-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted and to read as follows:

““Project management” means a professional service that manages a project’s schedule, cost, quality, safety, scope, and function, and ensuring that the project is completed on time and within budget.””

SECTION 3. House Bill No. 1155, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, is amended by amending section 3 to read as follows

“SECTION 3. Section 103D-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

“(d) Outside contractors may be utilized to prepare specifications and work statements in the development of a solicitation. Contractors paid for those services shall be precluded from bidding on or receiving a contract when they participated [~~in any way~~] in the development of the solicitation package or any resulting contract[-]; provided that an outside contractor who has been paid to prepare specifications and work statements in the development of a solicitation may bid on or receive a contract after they participated in the development of the solicitation package for the resulting contract if:

- (1) The purchasing agency is the department of transportation;
- (2) The director of transportation determines in writing that a waiver authorizing the outside contractor to bid on or receive a contract is in the best interests of the State; and
- (3) The solicitation package requires a procurement method that is allowable under federal statute; federal regulation; federal special experimental, demonstration project; or a federal approval of the procurement method.”

SECTION 4. House Bill No. 1155, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, is amended by amending section 4, page 3, lines 16-18, to read as follows:

“(3) A recommendation of whether the amendments made by section 3 of this Act should be made permanent, amended, or repealed; and”

SECTION 5. House Bill No. 1155, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, is amended by amending section 6 to read as follows:

“SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000; provided that section 3 of this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2027; provided further that section 103D-405(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which it read on the day prior to the effective date of this Act.”

Senator Dela Cruz moved that Floor Amendment No. 9 be adopted, seconded by Senator McKelvey.

“Mahalo, Mr. President, and I’d like to begin by thanking you, Senate leadership, and the Senate subject-matter committee chairs as well as the Ways and Means vice chair.

“The Senate budget responds not only to our present challenges but also prudently acknowledges future needs. As the year progresses, the Council on Revenues provides updates that reflect the economic conditions of the state, which we, the Senate, must build into our budget. In recent years, we have been tested. In 2020 and 2021, we faced the COVID-19 pandemic. Last year, we stood with the survivors of the Maui wildfires. This year, we are confronted with dramatic changes to federal policy and funding. Also this year, on March 12—coincidentally, the same day this bill passed Third Reading in the House—the Council on Revenues downgraded projections by half a billion dollars over the next two years.

“This body remains nimble during times of economic turbulence and uncertainty. This body continues to prioritize critical services and strategic economic investments while practicing fiscal responsibility.

“Even after the downward forecast projected by the Council on Revenues in March, we received Governor’s Messages 8 and 9, proposing \$25 million in additional spending. So, once again, I commend the Ways and Means committee and this body for their work in developing a budget that is grounded in the economic realities of this time.

“Of course, this year, fears of economic disruption have grown. So, let me take this opportunity to share how the Ways and Means committee’s values shine through the proposed budget.

“In Hawai‘i, we know that diversity is not just a strength, it is the fabric of our islands. Our budget expands access and celebrates our most vulnerable constituents. That’s why, over the biennium, our proposed budget includes:

- \$8 million for the Department of Education’s Hoakea program—in partnership with the Polynesian Voyaging Society, this program is designed to connect school communities with the values and mission of Mālama Honua;
- Over half a million dollars for the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to develop accessibility standards to build digital equity for non-English speakers and those with disabilities; and
- Over \$2 million for the Department of Human Services to strengthen core services for blind and visually impaired residents statewide.

“We are pushing toward greater self-reliance and a proposed budget that strengthens our food security and increases economic opportunities. That’s why, over the biennium, our proposed budget includes:

- Over \$1.5 million to help local entrepreneurs scale globally because Hawai‘i’s innovation should not stop at our shores;
- Over \$15 million for the First Lady’s Feeding Hawaii’s Keiki initiative, which aims to serve locally sourced school meals to over 150,000 students across public schools statewide;
- We also add \$25 million to protect our agricultural economy from invasive species and improving biosecurity

because feeding our keiki starts with protecting important agricultural lands; and

- Nearly half a million dollars to boost our local film and creative media industry because the world is hungry for stories and landscapes only Hawai‘i can show and tell.

“Finally, I am proud that our proposed budget prioritizes the health and safety of our communities and constituents. You’ll find in our proposed budget:

- Over \$1.5 million for the Office of Wellness and Resilience to continue Hawai‘i’s largest statewide health survey ever as well as the largest dataset using the Center for Disease Control’s National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health Worker Well-Being Questionnaire—this data will inform solutions to improve mental and socio-emotional health within our communities;
- We also add nearly \$10 million for the Department of Law Enforcement to ensure that they have the resources and the tools to keep our neighborhoods safe; and
- Over \$10 million for the Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement to protect natural resources and beauty that makes Hawai‘i so special and unique.

“To close, I want to again mahalo Senate subject-matter chairs for their tireless work with the departments in analyzing their budget requests, the Ways and Means committee members for developing a solution-oriented budget, and the vice chair and her team for crafting the CIP budget.

“Lastly, I’d like to thank the Ways and Means budget staff for their dedication and perseverance in putting together the Senate operating budget, especially our committee clerk, Scott Fuji; budget chief Colin Peros; budget analysts Kristen Hernandez, Leanne Chung, Kathy Sokugawa, and Lottie Davis; and CIP analyst Joe Kopshy; office manager Dot Fujinaga; and legislative aides Malachi Burrows, Trey Miller, and Jovanna Tiet. I’d like to invite the team to please rise and be recognized. Thank you.

“Colleagues, House Bill 300 is not just a budget; it is a blueprint for resilience. In the face of economic instability, the budget enables Hawai‘i to continue to take the reins of its future. Let this budget serve as a roadmap to revitalize small, rural towns across the state and reverse the brain-drain—from Hanalei to Hilo, Kapa‘a to Kona, and Waimea to Wahiawā. We are not just funding programs; we are building systems: systems that will sustain our people, stimulate the economy, and preserve our home lands for generations to come.

“I urge my colleagues to support the Senate draft of House Bill 300. Mahalo.”

Senator Moriwaki rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

“Mr. President, this budget is a reflection of the priorities of the Senate. I want to thank you, colleagues, and especially the Ways and Means chair for his leadership and the WAM staff for their hard work in crafting the Senate budget.

“Concerning the CIP budget, I thank you and our members in helping to identify district areas of need. The focus is on essentials: health and safety, compliance, infrastructure, maintenance and modernization of our state assets. We also stress Senate priorities: affordable housing and infrastructure, education and workforce development, economic development and diversification, and environmental sustainability. Highlights include:

- \$193,802,000 in fiscal year ‘26 and \$124,898,000 in fiscal year ‘27 for affordable housing and infrastructure projects statewide;

- \$607,750,000 for Department of Education and University of Hawai'i building improvements, repair, and maintenance and upgrading to compliance and code requirements;
- \$256,851,000 for economic development and diversification, including agricultural innovations; and
- \$17,950,000 in fiscal year '26 for environment sustainability projects.

"Many decisions still remain as we head into conference, but the budget created thus far will serve the state well. Colleagues, I ask you to vote 'yes' on this measure. Mahalo."

Senator Moriwaki rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

"House Bill 1308 proposes to effectuate 'safe gambling' in Hawai'i, but in its 62 pages, there is little beyond a Department of Health problem gambling prevention and treatment special fund offering counseling and treatment for disorders or problem gamblers. Where is the infrastructure for safe sports wagering, particularly for the vulnerable and young college students prone to digital gambling? The only regulations concern registration of sports wagering operators and suppliers, fees paid for licensing, and taxes on the adjusted gross sports wagering receipts. Please understand: The attorney general voiced strong opposition, stating, 'The only prohibition in this bill is for conducting unlicensed sports wagering by operators and suppliers who are required to have licenses. Anyone else could participate in unlicensed sports wagering activity without consequences. The bill also allows for completely unregulated and unlicensed gambling in the fantasy sports context.' And, please note, last week, the city of Baltimore sued the parent companies of FanDuel and DraftKings over deceptive and unfair practices that it believes creates a national problem. I've received email messages, as have you, from parents and ex-gamblers writing of the tragic loss of life and homes due to addiction to sports gaming by those who cannot keep their fingers from clicking to bet.

"It's easy to say that sports betting is already happening, so why not legalize it? That works only where there are effective regulatory enforcement structures in place. But that's not the case here. If this body passes this bill and the House agrees, sports wagering would become legal on July 1, 2025, but neither the organization nor the staff to ensure the public health and safety of our resident customers will be in place. And, sports wagering had a difficult time finding a home: first the Department of Business and Economic Development, then the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and, finally, the Department of Law Enforcement (DLE). Really? DLE has a newly confirmed director given a full plate of programs—from fireworks, firearms, a drug laboratory, a new fire marshal, and more—and having to recruit and train officers and staff. Adding gambling with this new regulatory and enforcement function may prove difficult even for a super director. If we pass, and the House agrees and the governor signs it into law, DLE will have less than 80 days to hire staff and adopt the needed sports wagering rules.

"Further, if this bill exists to generate revenue via a sports wagering tax, we should realize that all forms of gambling tend to be regressive; that means it hits lower-income residents the hardest. The department of taxation also said it needed more clarification on how sports wagering suppliers will be taxed and that it would not be possible to implement and enforce the new tax with the necessary forms, instructions, and system changes before January 1, 2027.

"Colleagues, I urge you to hear the concerns raised by constituents, other jurisdictions, and the departments charged with implementing this sports wagering bill. I urge you to vote 'no' on H.B. 1308. Mahalo."

Senator Inouye rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

“In stating my ‘no’ vote, I would like to enter the words of the good senator from District 12 into the Journal as if it were mine. Thank you, Mr. President.” (The Chair so ordered, by reference only.)

Senator Fevella rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

“As the senator from District 12 had said, I totally agree, so I want to have her words in the Journal as my own. Thank you, Senate President.” (The Chair so ordered, by reference only.)

Senator DeCorte rose to speak in opposition to the measure as follows:

“I would like to just note for the record, H.B. 1308 sends a wrong message out to our community with regards to sports wagering. Right now, in the economic times that we are in, this is not the message that we want to get out to the community, to gamble with whatever money that we have. Currently, residents are living paycheck to paycheck, and we need to reserve as much as we can to continue to feed our families, to continue to pay our everyday bills. Right now, this is not the time for this. I do believe also that it does open the door more to increase gambling. For years upon years, the Legislature has tried to pass multiple gambling bills, even going as far as putting a casino on Department of Hawaiian Home Lands. So, right now, at this time, I will stand in opposition, and I encourage my colleagues to also vote in opposition to H.B. 1308, H.D. 3, S.D. 2. Thank you.”

Senator McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

“I didn’t want to stand up, but I have to because I am voting in support of this bill, so I’d like to explain why. First of all, I thank the author, the people who worked on this bill because they encompass a truth that has been around is that the ban of daily fantasy as gambling is based upon an ill-informed former opinion of the attorney general. It’s not in law; it’s not in rule; it’s not anywhere but there, so this clarifies the fact that this is not the case. And, again, as previous bills have pointed out, if you look at the studies that have been done, there’s more of an element of chance which is gambling in the stock market than there is in daily fantasy, so maybe we should amend the bill.

“Also, we need this revenue because of what we are facing in the state of Hawai‘i from this unprecedented disaster in Washington, D.C. It’s not just the blatant upfront cuts—it’s the inflation; it’s the tariff wars. Screws right now have gone up 70 percent! Seventy percent for a screw right now. So the damage to Hawai‘i is far than just the less direct cuts; it’s all of the other secondary and tertiary damage, which is why we need to look to revenue—revenue that other states, many other states, have already. Many other states have this.

“And, finally, I do recognize there are social concerns. We should put more funding, as other states have done, into the programs to address the concerns, but there’s a lot of other things that are legal in this state which causes much more damage to our society—I point to alcohol. So, with that, I do stand in support of this measure, and I thank the committee and the members for considering this for further discussion. Thank you.”

“Could you have the words of the senator from District 12 entered as my own? Mahalo.” (The Chair so ordered, by reference only.)
