

FIFTY-SEVENTH DAY

Thursday, April 24, 2025

The Senate of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 6:37 p.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with the exception of Senators Awa, Chang, and Fevella who were excused.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifty-Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator Kanuha introduced Senator Francis A. Wong, who had served in the state Senate from 1970 to 1978 after serving in the state House of Representatives from 1967 to 1970. Accompanying him in the gallery was his wife, Mary Ann. Senator Kanuha noted that Senator Wong was a proud graduate of Saint Louis School and had earned his bachelor of arts and juris doctor from Georgetown University. Senator Kanuha observed that Senator Wong resided in Indian Wells, California, but that the Senate was lucky to welcome him back to Hawai'i that day. Senator Kanuha then thanked Senator Wong for his contributions to the state.
