## ORDER OF THE DAY

### THIRD READING

S.B. No. 2203, S.D. 1:

Senator Rhoads moved that S.B. No. 2203, S.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator Gabbard.

Senator Rhoads then offered the following floor amendment (Floor Amendment No. 1) to S.B. No. 2203, S.D. 1:

SECTION 1. Senate Bill No. 2203, S.D. 1, section 2, is amended by amending page 2, lines 13 to 17 to read as follows:

"(2) This section shall not apply to a law enforcement officer who is:

(a) Engaged in an authorized undercover assignment or operation or conducting related duties in support of an undercover assignment or operation; or

(b) Within the eyesight of another officer from the same law enforcement agency who is unmasked."

Senator Rhoads moved that Floor Amendment No. 1 be adopted, seconded by Senator Gabbard.
