# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FORFEITURE OF PROPERTY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 712A-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to	o read as follows:
3	"§71:	2A-4 Covered offenses. Offenses for which property is
4	subject to	o forfeiture under this chapter are:
5	(a)	All offenses which specifically authorize forfeiture;
6	(b)	Murder, kidnapping, gambling, criminal property
7		damage, robbery, bribery, extortion, theft,
8		unauthorized entry into motor vehicle, burglary, money
9		laundering, trademark counterfeiting, insurance fraud,
10		promoting a dangerous, harmful, or detrimental drug,
11		commercial promotion of marijuana, <u>unlawful</u>
12		methamphetamine trafficking, manufacturing of a
13		controlled substance with a child present, promoting
14		child abuse, or electronic enticement of a child which
15		is chargeable as a felony offense under state law;
16	(c)	The manufacture, sale, or distribution of a controlled
17		substance in violation of chapter 329, promoting
18		detrimental drugs or intoxicating compounds, promoting

pornography, promoting pornography for minors, or 1 promoting prostitution, which is chargeable as a 2 felony or misdemeanor offense, but not as a petty 3 misdemeanor, under state law; and 4 The attempt, conspiracy, solicitation, coercion, or 5 (d) intimidation of another to commit any offense for 6 which property is subject to forfeiture." 7 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored. 8 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 10 begun, before its effective date. 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 12
