## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELORS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 453D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending the definition of "practice of mental health
- 3 counseling" to read as follows:
- 4 ""Practice of mental health counseling" means the rendering
- 5 of professional counseling services based on specialized
- 6 education, training, and experience to individuals, families, or
- 7 groups for compensation, monetary or otherwise. These
- 8 professional counseling services include applying the respective
- 9 principles, methods, and theories of counseling, human
- 10 development, learning theory, group and family dynamics,
- 11 rehabilitation, and the etiology of mental illness and
- 12 dysfunctional behavior [to define], and defining goals and
- 13 [develop] developing a treatment plan of action aimed toward the
- 14 prevention, treatment, and resolution of mental and emotional
- 15 dysfunction and intra or interpersonal disorders to all persons
- 16 irrespective of diagnosis. "Practice of mental health
- 17 counseling" includes but is not limited to:

1	(1)	The assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of, and
2		counseling for, mental and emotional disorders;
3	(2)	The assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of, and
4		counseling for, substance abuse and conduct disorders
5		defined in the approved diagnostic and statistical
6		manual for mental disorders;
7	(3)	The application of educational techniques aimed at the
8		prevention of these disorders; and
9	(4)	The provision of consultative services to individuals,
10		couples, families, groups, organizations, and
11		communities."
12	SECT	ION 2. Section 453D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to	o read as follows:
14	"[ <del>-</del> ]]	§453D-6[] Exemptions. (a) This chapter shall not
15	apply to:	
16	(1)	A person doing work within the duties of the person's
17		profession that overlaps with the practice of mental
18		health counseling; provided that no such person shall
19		use a title stating or implying that the person is a
20		"licensed mental health counselor" or "mental health
21		[counselor, or describe or refer to the
22		person's services as mental health counseling;

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(2)	Any person who is a duly recognized member of the
	clergy; provided that the person functions only within
	the person's capacity as a member of the clergy; and
	provided further that the person does not represent
	the person to be a "licensed mental health counselor"
	or "mental health [counselor," counselor," or
	describe or refer to the person's services as mental
	health counseling;

Any student enrolled in an accredited educational 9 (3) institution in a recognized program of study leading 10 [toward] towards attainment of a graduate degree in 11 mental health counseling or other professional field; 12 provided that the student's activities and services 13 14 are part of a prescribed course of study supervised by the accredited educational institution and the student 15 is identified by an appropriate title, including but 16 not limited to "mental health counseling student" or 17 "trainee", "clinical psychology student" or 18 ["trainee", " "social work student" or 19 ["trainee",] "trainee," "marriage and family 20 counseling student" or ["trainee",] "trainee," or any 21 22 title that clearly indicates training status;

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1	(4)	Any individual who uses the title of "mental health
2		counselor intern" for the purpose of obtaining
3		clinical experience in accordance with section
1		453D-7(a)(3)·

- (5) Any person employed by a federal, state, or county government agency in a counseling position, but only at those times when the employee is carrying out the duties and responsibilities as a counselor in governmental employment; or
- 10 (6) Any person who is obtaining supervised clinical 11 experience for licensure as a psychologist, social worker, marriage and family therapist, or as another 12 licensed professional; provided that the person's 13 14 title indicates a trainee or intern status; and provided further that the person does not purport to 15 be a "licensed mental health counselor" or "mental 16 **17** health counselor".
- (b) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent qualified members of other licensed professions as defined by any law or rule of the department, including but not limited to social workers, registered nurses, psychologists, marriage and family therapists, or physicians, from providing mental health

- 1 counseling or advertising that they provide mental health
- 2 counseling to individuals, couples, or families consistent with
- 3 the accepted standards of their respective licensed professions;
- 4 provided that no such persons shall use a title stating or
- 5 implying that they are licensed mental health counselors unless
- 6 the persons are licensed pursuant to this chapter.
- 7 (c) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to
- 8 supersede the regulation of registered rehabilitation
- 9 specialists from the department of labor and industrial
- 10 relations. Further, no registered rehabilitation specialist
- 11 shall use a title stating or implying that the registered
- 12 rehabilitation specialist is a licensed mental health counselor
- 13 unless the person is licensed pursuant to this chapter."
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 453D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 16 "(a) Any person who applies to the department after
- 17 July 1, 2005, shall be issued a license by the department if the
- 18 applicant provides satisfactory evidence to the department that
- 19 the applicant is qualified for licensure pursuant to the
- 20 requirements of this chapter and meets the following
- 21 qualifications:

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1	(1)	A master's degree or doctoral degree from an
2		accredited educational institution in counseling or in
3		an allied field related to the practice of mental
4		health counseling that includes or is supplemented by
5		graduate level course work in counseling comprising a
6		minimum of forty-eight semester hours or seventy-two
7		quarter hours in the following course areas, with a
8		minimum of three semester hours in each course area as
9		indicated below:
10		(A) Human growth and development, including but not
11		limited to the study of life span development,
12		strategies to facilitate that development and
13		transitions, theories of learning and personality
14		development, and human behavior to include
15		crisis, disabilities, addictive behavior, and
16		environmental factors;

(B) Social and cultural foundations, including but not limited to the study of issues and trends in a multicultural and diverse society, including characteristics of diverse groups that may include but are not limited to age, race, religious or sexual preference, physical

1		disability, ethnicity and culture, gender,
2		socioeconomics, intellectual ability, and
3		individual, family, and group strategies with
4		diverse populations;
5	(C)	Counseling theories and applications, including
6		but not limited to counseling and consultation,
7		including both individual and systems
8		perspectives, interviewing, assessment, and
9		counseling skills, as well as applying
10		principles, methods, and theories of counseling,
11		treatment and counseling of mental and emotional
12		disorders, and educational techniques aimed at
13		preventing such disorders with individuals and
14		families;
15	(D)	Group theory and practice, including but not
16		limited to principles of group dynamics, group
17		process, group leadership styles, theories and
18		methods of group counseling, and the application
19		of theory to the group processes;
20	(E)	Career and lifestyle development, including but
21		not limited to the study of vocational
22		development theories and decisionmaking models,

1		assessment instruments, and techniques, types,
2		sources, and uses of occupational and educational
3		information systems, career development
4		applications, and career counseling processes,
5		techniques, and resources;
6	(F)	Appraisal of human behavior, including but not
7		limited to assessment and diagnosis [or] of
8		disorders with an emphasis on DSM-IV categories,
9		and an understanding of these disorders relative
10		to the counseling context;
11	(G)	Tests and measurements, including but not limited
12		to theoretical and historical bases for
13		assessment techniques, assessment methods,
14		including analysis of various types of tests in
15		order to select, administer, interpret, and use
16		assessment and evaluation instruments and
17		techniques in counseling;
18	(H)	Research and program evaluation, including but
19		not limited to research design and methods,
20		statistical analysis, principles, practices, and
21		application of needs assessment, and program
22		evaluation; and

		(1) ITOTOSSIONAT OFFICIACION and Centes, including
2		but not limited to the history of the helping
3		profession, professional roles and functions,
4		ethical standards, confidentiality, professional
5		organizations, and the public policy process,
6		including advocacy on behalf of the profession
7		and its clientele;
8	(2)	At least two academic terms of supervised mental
9		health practicum intern experience for graduate credit
10		of at least three semester hours or five quarter hours
11		per academic term in a mental health counseling
12		setting with three hundred hours of supervised client
13		contact; the practicum experience shall be completed
14		under the clinical supervision of a person who is
15		licensed as a mental health counselor, psychologist,
16		clinical social worker, advanced practice registered
17		nurse with a specialty in mental health, marriage and
18		family therapist, or physician with a specialty in
19		psychiatry;
20	(3)	Completion [+]of[+] three thousand hours of post-
21		graduate [direct counseling work] experience in the
22		practice of mental health counseling with one hundred

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1		hours of face-to-face clinical supervision [within a
2		two year period; and] which shall be completed in no
3		less than two years and in no more than four years,
4		under the clinical supervision of a person who is a
5		licensed mental health counselor, psychologist,
6		clinical social worker, advanced practice registered
7		nurse with a specialty in mental health, marriage and
8		family therapist, or physician with a specialty in
9		psychiatry; and
10	(4)	Passed the National Counselor Examination for
11		Licensure and Certification."
12	SECT	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
