A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES DIVISION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. Although funds were appropriated to the
- 5 department of health for healthy start services for the period
- 6 beginning July 1, 2005 and ending June 30, 2006, the department
- 7 of health has a critical need for additional funds.
- 8 On May 31, 2005, the State of Hawaii was deemed in
- 9 compliance with the Felix Consent Decree, marking the end of
- 10 federal court oversight for services including early
- 11 intervention services. The department of health must continue
- 12 to carry out its obligations to provide early intervention
- 13 services for children age zero to three years with developmental
- 14 delays or biological or environmental risks, as mandated by Part
- 15 C of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education
- 16 Improvement Act of 2004 (P.L. 108-446), sections 321-351 to 321-
- 17 357, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the Hawaii early intervention

- 1 state plan. The department must ensure that eligible children
- 2 and their families receive the services mandated by the
- 3 Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act Part C
- 4 that are identified on their individual family support plans.
- 5 Appropriated funds will be expended before the end of this
- 6 fiscal year, due to a decrease in funding for healthy start
- 7 purchase-of-service programs for home visiting services. These
- 8 purchase-of-service programs provide support services to
- 9 families at risk, to assure healthy and safe child development.
- 10 To continue services at the present level, an additional
- 11 \$1,000,000 from the early intervention special fund is needed.
- 12 The current ceiling for the early intervention special fund is
- 13 \$4,203,974 for fiscal year 2005-2006. This measure will
- 14 increase the ceiling by \$1,000,000 to \$5,203,974.
- SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the early
- 16 intervention special fund the sum of \$1,000,000, or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary, for fiscal year 2005-2006, to be
- 18 used for healthy start purchase-of-service programs for home
- 19 visiting services.
- 20 SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 21 department of health for the purposes of this Act. `
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
