A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMISSION FOR NATIONAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 90D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 4 "(a) Members of the commission shall be appointed by the
- 5 governor on a bipartisan basis subject to section 26-34. The
- 6 commission shall consist of not fewer than fifteen and not more
- 7 than twenty-five members. Not more than fifty per cent of the
- 8 commission plus one member may be from the same political party.
- 9 To the extent possible, the commission shall be balanced
- 10 according to race, ethnicity, age, disability, and gender
- 11 characteristics. All appointments shall be for [four-year]
- 12 three-year terms. Members shall not serve more than two
- 13 consecutive terms. The commission shall include:
- 14 (1) An individual with expertise in the educational,
- training, and developmental needs of youths,
- particularly disadvantaged youths;

2		involvement of older adults in service and
3		volunteerism;
4	(3)	A representative of community-based agencies or
5		community-based organizations within the State;
6	(4)	The superintendent of education, or a designee;
