A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO USE OF INTOXICANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291E-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: "(b) The test or tests shall be administered at the 3 request of a law enforcement officer having probable cause to 4 5 believe the person operating a vehicle upon a public way, 6 street, road, or highway or on or in the waters of the State is under the influence of an intoxicant or is under the age of 7 8 twenty-one and has consumed a measurable amount of alcohol, only 9 after: 10 A lawful arrest; and (1)The person has been informed by a law enforcement 11 (2) officer [of the sanctions under section 291E-41 or 12 13 291E-65, as applicable to the offense.] that the person may refuse to submit to testing under this 14 chapter." 15 SECTION 2. Section 291E-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17

1	"[{]\$291E-15[}] Refusal to submit to breath, blood, or
2	urine test; subject to administrative revocation proceedings.
3	If a person under arrest refuses to submit to a breath, blood,
4	or urine test, none shall be given, except as provided in
5	section 291E-21[, but the person shall be subject]. Upon the
6	law enforcement officer's determination that the person under
7	arrest has refused to submit to a breath, blood, or urine test,
8	if applicable, then a law enforcement officer shall:
9	(1) Inform the person under arrest of the sanctions under
10	section 291E-41 or 291E-65; and
11	(2) Ask the person if the person still refuses to submit
12	to a breath, blood, or urine test, thereby subjecting
13	the person to the procedures and sanctions under part
14	III or section 291E-65, as applicable $[\div]$:
15	provided that if the law enforcement officer fails to comply
16	with paragraphs (1) and (2), the person shall not be subject to
17	the refusal sanctions under part III or section 291E-65."
18	SECTION 3. Section 291E-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
20	"(a) Whenever a person is arrested for a violation of
21	section 291E-61 or 291E-61.5 on a determination by the arresting
22	law enforcement officer that:

1	(1) There was reasonable suspicion to stop the vehicle or
2	the vehicle was stopped at an intoxicant control
3	roadblock established and operated in compliance with
4	sections 291E-19 and 291E-20; and
5	(2) There was probable cause to believe that the person
6	was operating the vehicle while under the influence of
7	an intoxicant;
8	the law enforcement officer immediately shall take possession of
9	any license held by the person and request the person to take a
10	test for alcohol concentration, in the case of an alcohol
11	related offense, or a test for drug content in the blood or
12	urine, in the case of a drug related offense. The law
13	enforcement officer shall inform the person that, in the case of
14	an alcohol related offense, the person shall elect to take a
15	breath test, a blood test, or both, pursuant to section
16	291E-11[\pm], but that the person may refuse to submit to testing
17	under this chapter. In the case of a drug related offense, the
18	person shall elect to take a blood test, a urine test, or both,
19	pursuant to section 291E-11[. The], after being informed that
20	the person may refuse to submit to testing under this chapter.
21	When applicable under section 291E-15, the law enforcement
22	officer also shall [inform]:

1	<u>(1)</u>	<u>Inform</u> the person of the sanctions under section				
2		291E-41, including the sanction for refusing to take a				
3		breath, blood, or urine test[-], if applicable; and				
4	(2)	Ask the person if the person still refuses to submit				
5		to a breath, blood, or urine test, upon the law				
6		enforcement officer's determination that, after the				
7		person has been informed by a law enforcement officer				
8		that the person may refuse to submit to testing, the				
9		person under arrest has refused to submit to a breath,				
10		blood, or urine test.				
11	Thereafter	, the law enforcement officer shall complete and issue				
12	to the person a notice of administrative revocation and shall					
13	indicate thereon whether the notice shall serve as a temporary					
14	permit. The notice shall serve as a temporary permit, unless,					
15	at the time of arrest: the person was unlicensed; the person's					
16	license or privilege to operate a vehicle was revoked or					
17	suspended;	or the person had no license in the person's				
18	possession	1. "				
19	SECTI	ON 4. Section 291E-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
20	amended by	amending subsection (b) to read as follows:				
21	"(b)	The notice, when completed by the law enforcement				
22	officer an	d issued to the respondent, shall contain at a minimum				

1	the follow	wing information relating to the incident that gives
2	rise to th	ne issuance of the notice of administrative revocation:
3	(1)	Information identifying the respondent;
4	(2)	The specific violation for which the respondent was
5		arrested;
6	(3)	The date issued and the date the administrative
7		revocation is scheduled to go into effect;
8	[-(4)	That the respondent was informed of the sanctions of
9		this part and of the consequences of refusing to be
10		tested for alcohol concentration or drug content in
11		the blood or urine and whether the respondent
12		consented to be tested;
13	(5)]	$\underline{(4)}$ The expiration date of the temporary permit, and
14		the temporary motor vehicle registration and temporary
15		number plates if applicable; and
16	[-(6)]	(5) That the issuance of the notice of administrative
17		revocation will be administratively reviewed."
18	SECT	ION 5. Section 291E-36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
20	"(a)	Whenever a respondent has been arrested for a
21	violation	of section 291E-61 or 291E-61.5 and submits to a test
22	that esta	blishes: the respondent's alcohol concentration was

1	.08 or more; the presence, in the respondent's blood or urine,
2	of any drug that is capable of impairing the respondent's
3	ability to operate a vehicle in a careful and prudent manner; or
4	whenever a respondent has been involved in a collision resulting
5	in injury or death and a blood or urine test performed pursuant
6	to section 291E-21 establishes that the respondent's alcohol
7	concentration was .08 or more or establishes the presence in the
8	respondent's blood or urine of any drug that is capable of
9	impairing the respondent's ability to operate a vehicle in a
10	careful and prudent manner, the following shall be forwarded
11	immediately to the director:
12	(1) A copy of the arrest report or the report of the law
13	enforcement officer who issued the notice of
14	administrative revocation to the person involved in a
15	collision resulting in injury or death and the sworn
16	statement of the arresting law enforcement officer or
17	the officer who issued the notice of administrative
18	revocation, stating facts that establish that:
19	(A) There was reasonable suspicion to stop the
20	vehicle, the vehicle was stopped at an intoxicant
21	control roadblock established and operated in
22	compliance with sections 291E-19 and 291E-20, or

1	the respondent was tested pursuant to section
2	291E-21;

4	respondent had been operating the vehicle while

21	(1)	There existed reasonable suspicion to stop the
22		vehicle, the vehicle was stopped at an intoxicant

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1		control roadblock established and operated in
2		compliance with sections 291E-19 and 291E-20, or the
3		person was tested pursuant to section 291E-21;
4	(2)	There existed probable cause to believe that the
5		respondent operated the vehicle while under the
6		influence of an intoxicant; and
7	(3)	The evidence proves by a preponderance that:
8		(A) The respondent operated the vehicle while under
9		the influence of an intoxicant; or
10		(B) The respondent operated the vehicle and refused
11		to submit to a breath, blood, or urine test after
12		being informed [of]:
13		(i) That the person may refuse to submit to
14		testing in compliance with section 291E-11;
15		and

7	revocation	only if the director determines that:
8	(1)	There existed reasonable suspicion to stop the
9		vehicle, the vehicle was stopped at an intoxicant
10		control roadblock established and operated in
11		compliance with sections 291E-19 and 291E-20, or the
12		person was tested pursuant to section 291E-21;
13	(2)	There existed probable cause to believe that the
14		respondent operated the vehicle while under the
15		influence of an intoxicant; and
16	(3)	The evidence proves by a preponderance that:
17		(A) The respondent operated the vehicle while under
18		the influence of an intoxicant; or
19		(B) The respondent operated the vehicle [and,] and
20		refused to submit to a breath, blood, or urine
21		test after being informed [of]:
22		(i) That the person may refuse to submit to

1		testing in compliance with section 291E-11;
2		and
3	<u>(ii)</u>	of the sanctions of this part[, refused] and

15	person st	ill refuses to submit to a breath, blood, or
16	urine tes	t, in compliance with the requirements of
17	section 2	91E-15,
18	the revocation impo	sed under subsection (b)(1), (2), (3), and
19	(4) shall be for a	period of one year, two years, four years,
20	and a lifetime, res	pectively.

1	(e) In addition to subsection (d), any motor vehicle		
2	registration of a respondent who is a repeat intoxicated driver		
3	and who refused to be tested after being informed $[\frac{of}{2}]$:		
4	(1) That the person may refuse to submit to testing in		
5	compliance with section 291E-11; and		
6	(2) Of the sanctions of this part and then asked if the		
7	person still refuses to submit to a breath, blood, or		
8	urine test, in compliance with the requirements of		
9	section 291E-15,		
10	shall be revoked for the periods specified in subsection (d),		
11	and the respondent shall be prohibited from subsequently		
12	registering any motor vehicle for the applicable revocation		
13	period."		
14	SECTION 9. Section 291E-65, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
15	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:		
16	"(a) If a person under arrest for operating a vehicle		
17	after consuming a measurable amount of alcohol, pursuant to		
18	section 291E-64, refuses to submit to a breath or blood test,		
19	none shall be given, except as provided in section 291E-21, but		
20	the arresting law enforcement officer, as soon as practicable,		
21	shall submit an affidavit to a district judge of the circuit in		
22	which the arrest was made, stating:		

1	(1)	That at the time of the arrest, the arresting officer
2		had probable cause to believe the arrested person was
3		under the age of twenty-one and had been operating a
4		vehicle upon a public way, street, road, or highway or
5		on or in the waters of the State with a measurable
6		amount of alcohol;
7	[-(2) -	That the arrested person had been informed of the
8		sanctions of this section; and
9	(3)]	(2) That the arrested person was informed that the
10		person may refuse to submit to a breath or blood test,
11		in compliance with section 291E-11;
12	<u>(3)</u>	That the person had refused to submit to a breath or
13		blood test[+];
14	(4)	That the arrested person was:

1	(b)	Upon receipt of the affidavit, the district judge
2	shall hol	d a hearing within twenty days. The district judge
3	shall hea	r and determine:
4	(1)	Whether the arresting law enforcement officer had
5		probable cause to believe that the person was under
6		the age of twenty-one and had been operating a vehicle
7		upon a public way, street, road, or highway or on or
8		in the waters of the State with a measurable amount of
9		alcohol;
10	(2)	Whether the person was lawfully arrested;
11	[(3)	Whether the arresting officer had informed the person
12		of the sanctions of this section; and]
13	(3)	Whether the person was informed that the person may
14		refuse to submit to a breath or blood test, in
15		compliance with section 291E-11;
16	(4)	Whether the person refused to submit to a test of the
17		person's breath or blood[+];
18	(5)	Whether the person was:
19		(A) Informed of the sanctions of this section; and
20		then

1	(B) Asked if the person still refuses to submit to a
2	breath or blood test, in compliance with the
3	requirements of section 291E-15; and
4	(6) Whether the person continued to refuse to submit to a
5	breath or blood test."
6	SECTION 10. This Act does not affect rights and duties
7	that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
8	were begun, before its effective date.
9	SECTION 11. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2007.
