A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL MATCHMAKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 489N-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending the definition of "marital history
- 3 information" to read as follows:
- 4 ""Marital history information" means a declaration of [the
- 5 person's] a Hawaii resident's current marital status, the number
- 6 of times the [person] Hawaii resident has previously been
- 7 married, the number of domestic abuse orders of protection
- 8 issued against the Hawaii resident, and whether any previous
- 9 marriages by the Hawaii resident occurred as a result of
- 10 receiving services from an international matchmaking
- 11 organization."
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 489N-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- "[f]\$489N-2[] Dissemination of criminal record and
- 15 marital history information. (a) Each international
- 16 matchmaking organization doing business in this State shall:

1	(1)	Notify all recruits that criminal history record
2		information and marital history information is
3		available upon request;
4	(2)	Provide the notice required by paragraph (1) in the
5		recruit's native language and display it in a manner
6		that separates it from other information, is
7		conspicuous, and in lettering not less than
8		one-quarter of an inch high; [and]
9	(3)	Upon request, disseminate to a recruit in the
10		recruit's native language all criminal conviction
11		information and marital history information in the
12		possession of the international matchmaking
13		organization relating to a Hawaii resident about whom
14		any information is provided to the recruit $[+]$:
15	(4)	Require a Hawaii resident requesting the services of
16		an international matchmaking organization to submit or
17		authorize the international matchmaking organization
18		access to the resident's complete criminal history and
19		marital history information; and
20	(5)	Submit an annual report on its business activities to
21		the department of commerce and consumer affairs.

4	further s	ervices to the recruit or the Hawaii resident with

8	(1)	The complete transcript of any criminal history record
9		of the Hawaii resident or a statement that there is no
10		record of convictions; provided that these are
11		obtained from the Hawaii criminal justice data center
12		based on a submission of fingerprint impressions and
13		sent directly to the organization by the Hawaii
14		criminal justice data center; and
15	(2)	The Hawaii resident's marital history information,
16		accompanied by an affirmation by the Hawaii resident
17		that any marital history information provided is
18		complete and accurate and includes information
19		regarding the Hawaii resident's marriages, annulments,
20		[and] dissolutions, and the number of domestic abuse
21		orders of protection issued against the Hawaii

3	SECTION 3. Section 489N-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"[+]§489N-3[+] Jurisdiction. (a) An international
6	matchmaking organization shall be deemed to be doing business is
7	Hawaii if it contracts for matchmaking services with a Hawaii
8	resident or is considered to be doing business under any other
9	law of this State.
10	(b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, Hawaii
11	residents using the services of an international matchmaking
12	organization shall be subject to the laws of this State."
13	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
