A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATUROPATHY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 455, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§455- Authority to administer natural medicines by
5	injection. The board by rule shall:
6	(1) Adopt a formulary of natural medicines that
7	naturopaths may administer by injection;
8	(2) Establish the qualifications necessary to administer
9	natural medicines by injection; and
10	(3) Grant the authority to qualified naturopaths to
11	administer natural medicines by injection."
12	SECTION 2. Section 455-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending the definition of "naturopathy" to read as
14	follows:
15	""Naturopathy" means the practice of:
16	(1) Natural medicine, natural therapeutics, and natural
17	procedures, for the purpose of removing toxic
18	conditions from the body and improving the quality,

1		quantity, harmony, balance, and flow of the vital
2		fluids, vital tissues, and vital energy; and
3	(2)	Diagnosing, treating, and caring for patients using a
4		system of practice that bases its treatment of
5		physiological functions and abnormal conditions on
6		natural laws governing the human body: [utilizing]
7		using physiological, psychological, and mechanical
8		methods, such as air, water, light, sunshine, heat,
9		[and] cold, earth, phytotherapy, physiotherapy,
10		mechano-therapy, naturopathic corrections and
11		manipulation, and natural methods or modalities,
12		together with natural or homeopathic medicines,
13		natural foods, [and] herbs, and nature's remedies of
14		the type taught in education and training at
15		naturopathic medical colleges.
16	The pract	ice of naturopathy includes the administration of
17	natural m	edicines using appropriate methods, including injection
18	as author	ized by the board. The practice of naturopathy
19	excludes	surgery, application of x-rays, and prescribing,
20	dispensin	g, or using prescription drugs except as provided for
21	in the de	finition of natural medicine."

1	SECTION 3. (a) The department of commerce and consumer
2	affairs shall establish a temporary advisory committee on the
3	administration of natural medicines by injection. The advisory
4	committee shall be composed of:
5	(1) Two persons licensed as naturopathic physicians under
6	chapter 455 and appointed by the board of examiners is
7	naturopathy;
8	(2) One person licensed in medicine under chapter 453 and
9	appointed by the board of medical examiners; and
10	(3) One person licensed as a pharmacist under chapter 461
11	and appointed by the board of pharmacy.
12	(b) The temporary advisory committee on the administratio
13	of natural medicines by injection shall, at minimum, collect
14	pertinent curriculum and clinical information from all schools
15	of naturopathy accredited by, or that have received candidacy
16	status with, a regional or national accrediting body recognized
17	by the United States Department of Education.
18	(c) The temporary advisory committee on the administratio
19	of natural medicines by injection shall develop and submit
20	recommendations to the board of examiners in naturopathy on:
21	(1) A formulary of natural medicines that naturopaths may
22	administer by injection; and

1	(2)	The qualifications necessary for administering natural

- natural medicines by injection shall serve without compensation,
- and shall be dissolved upon the approval of rules establishing a 5

- SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7
- and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 8
- SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 9

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1155

Honorable Members Twenty-Third Legislature State of Hawaii

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, I am returning herewith, without my approval, House Bill No. 1155, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Naturopathy."

The purpose of this bill is to require the Board of Examiners in Naturopathy to adopt a formulary and qualifications for administering natural medicines by injection and to grant to qualified naturopaths the authority to administer natural medicines by injection.

This bill is objectionable because it does not provide adequate protection for the health and safety of the public. While the practice of naturopathic medicine has a long history and the administration of "natural medicines" by injection is part of that history, this bill does not sufficiently define "natural medicine." Although naturopaths would not have access to substances controlled under chapter 329 (Uniform Controlled Substances Act), Hawaii Revised Statutes, or prescription drugs under the purview of chapter 328 (Food, Drugs, and Cosmetics), Hawaii Revised Statutes, there are many substances on the market that are not controlled by law or regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration and that are touted as "natural." The injection of some of these substances may cause serious harm or death to recipients of such injections.

Additionally, this bill provides that a temporary advisory committee on the administration of natural medicines by injection be formed to recommend to the Board of Examiners in

Naturopathy a formulary of natural medicines that naturopaths may administer by injection and the qualifications necessary for administering natural medicines by injection. This committee would be composed of two persons licensed as naturopathic physicians under chapter 455 (Naturopathy), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and appointed by the Board of Examiners in Naturopathy; one person licensed in medicine under chapter 453 (Medicine and Surgery), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and appointed by the Board of Medical Examiners; and one person licensed as a pharmacist under chapter 461 (Pharmacists and Pharmacy), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and appointed by the Board of Pharmacy. The temporary committee's recommendations would be acted upon by the Board of Examiners in Naturopathy, composed of three naturopathic physicians and two public members. Thus, the determination of what constitutes a "natural medicine," as well as the qualifications necessary to inject those substances into patients, would be primarily the decision of naturopaths themselves.

It would be preferable that any formulary of injectable "natural medicines" and the qualifications to administer by injection be overseen by medical doctors, as is the case with nurses.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning House Bill No. 1155 without my approval.
