A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TIME LIMITATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 701-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (3) to read as follows:
3	" (3)	If the period prescribed in subsection (2) has
4	expired,	a prosecution may nevertheless be commenced for:
5	(a)	Any offense an element of which is either fraud_
6		deception, as defined in section 708-800, or a breach
7		of fiduciary obligation within three years after
8		discovery of the offense by an aggrieved party or by a
9		person who has a legal duty to represent an aggrieved
10		party and who is oneself not a party to the offense,
11		but in no case shall this provision extend the period
12		of limitation by more than six years from the
13		expiration of the period of limitation prescribed in
14		subsection (2);
15	(b)	Any offense based on misconduct in office by a public
16		officer or employee at any time when the defendant is
17		in public office or employment or within two years
18		thereafter, but in no case shall this provision extend

1		the period of limitation by more than three years from
2		the expiration of the period of limitation prescribed
3		in subsection (2); and
4	(c)	Any felony offense involving evidence containing
5		deoxyribonucleic acid from the offender, if a test
6		confirming the presence of deoxyribonucleic acid is
7		performed prior to expiration of the period of
8		limitation prescribed in subsection (2), but in no
9		case shall this provision extend the period of
10		limitation by more than ten years from the expiration
11		of the period of limitation prescribed in subsection
12		(2)."
13	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
14	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
15	begun, be	fore its effective date.
16	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
