A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TON 1. Section 286-102.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"[+]	§286-102.6[] Provisional license for persons under
4	the age o	f eighteen. (a) A person may be granted a provisional
5	license t	o drive passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight
6	rating, b	uses designed to transport fifteen or fewer occupants,
7	and truck	s and vans having a gross vehicle weight rating of
8	fifteen t	housand pounds or less if the person:
9	(1)	Is at least sixteen years of age but under the age of
10		eighteen;
11	(2)	Holds an instruction permit and has held the permit
12		for a period of at least one hundred eighty days and
13		there is no pending proceeding that might result in
14		the suspension or revocation of the instruction
15		permit; and
16	(3)	Satisfactorily completes all requirements of sections
17		286-108 and 286-109.

1	(b)	The provisional license shall entitle the provisional
2	licensee	to drive the class of motor vehicles specified in
3	subsectio	n (a) upon the roadways of the State; provided that:
4	(1)	The provisional licensee shall have the provisional
5		license in the provisional licensee's immediate
6		possession while driving;
7	(2)	All occupants of the motor vehicle shall be restrained
8		by safety belts or a child passenger restraint system
9		as required under sections 291-11.5 and 291-11.6;
10	(3)	The provisional licensee shall not transport more than
11		one person under the age of eighteen, unless the
12		person is, with respect to the provisional licensee:
13		(A) A household member; or
14		(B) A household member's foster or hanai child,
15		without being accompanied and supervised by a licensed
16		driver who is the provisional licensee's parent or
17		guardian; and
18	(4)	Except as provided in subsection (c), whenever the
19		provisional licensee is driving between the hours of
20		11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., a licensed driver who is the
21		provisional licensee's parent or guardian and is
22		licensed to operate the same category of motor vehicle

1		as the licensee, shall be in the motor vehicle and
2		shall occupy the passenger seat beside the licensee.
3	(c)	A provisional licensee may drive between the hours of
4	11:00 p.m	. and 5:00 a.m. without a licensed parent or guardian
5	in the mo	tor vehicle under the following conditions:
6	(1)	The provisional licensee is traveling to or from the
7		provisional licensee's place of employment, operation
8		of the motor vehicle is necessary for this purpose,
9		and the provisional licensee keeps in the provisional
10		licensee's possession a signed statement from the
11		employer containing the employer's name, address,
12		telephone number, and verification of employment and
13		work hours; or
14	(2)	The provisional licensee is traveling to or from a
15		school-authorized activity of the provisional
16		licensee, operation of a motor vehicle is necessary
17		for this purpose, and the provisional licensee keeps
18		in the provisional licensee's possession a signed
19		statement from a parent or guardian containing the
20		parent's or guardian's name, address, and telephone
21		number, and verification that operation of the motor

1	vehicle by the provisional licensee is necessary to
2	travel to or from the school-authorized activity;
3	provided that the provisional licensee shall not transport more
4	than one person under the age of eighteen between the hours of
5	11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. without being accompanied and
6	supervised by a licensed driver who is the provisional
7	licensee's parent or guardian.
8	(d) If the provisional licensee violates any of the
9	requirements of subsection (b) or (c):
10	(1) For a first violation of any requirement, the
11	provisional license shall be suspended for a period of
12	three months by a district court or family court
13	judge. If the person's provisional license is
14	suspended, the person shall not be eligible for
15	reissuance of the provisional license or issuance of a
16	driver's license until:
17	(A) The person is eighteen years of age; or
18	(B) Three months have elapsed since the date of
19	suspension,
20	whichever is sooner, and the person has otherwise
21	satisfied the requirements of this chapter; and

1	(2)	For a second or any subsequent violation of any
2		requirement, the provisional license shall be revoked
3		for six months by a district court or family court
4		judge. If the person's provisional license is
5		revoked, the person shall not be eligible for
6		reissuance of the provisional license or issuance of a
7		driver's license until:
8		(A) The person is eighteen years of age; or
9		(B) Six months have elapsed since the date of
10		revocation,
11		whichever is sooner, and the person has otherwise
12		satisfied the requirements of this chapter.
13	(e)	If the provisional licensee is [convicted] adjudicated
14	of an off	ense relating to the operation of a motor vehicle other
15	than the	requirements of subsection (b) or (c):
16	(1)	For a first [conviction,] adjudication, the
17		provisional license shall be suspended or revoked by a
18		district court or family court judge, in addition to
19		any other penalties that may be prescribed by law. If
20		the person's provisional license is suspended or
21		revoked, the person shall not be eligible for

1		reissuance of the provisional license or issuance of a
2		driver's license until:
3		(A) The person is eighteen years of age; or
4		(B) Six months have elapsed since the date of
5		suspension or revocation,
6		whichever is sooner, and the person has otherwise
7		satisfied the requirements of this chapter; and
8	(2)	For a second or any subsequent [conviction,]
9		adjudication, the provisional license shall be revoked
10		for one year by a district court or family court
11		judge, in addition to any other penalties that may be
12		prescribed by law. If the person's provisional
13		license is revoked, the person shall not be eligible
14		for reissuance of the provisional license or issuance
15		of a driver's license until:
16		(A) The person is eighteen years of age; or
17		(B) One year has elapsed since the date of
18		revocation,
19		whichever is later, and the person has otherwise
20		satisfied the requirements of this chapter.

1 A provisional licensee may be issued a driver's 2 license in accordance with this chapter if the provisional 3 licensee: Has satisfactorily held a provisional license for at 4 (1)5 least six months; 6 (2) Has no pending proceeding that might result in the suspension or revocation of the license; 7 8 Is at least seventeen years of age; and (3) 9 (4)Has satisfactorily complied with all requirements of 10 this chapter. 11 (q) If not suspended or revoked, the provisional license 12 shall expire on the date of the provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday. 13 The fee for a provisional license shall be set in 14 accordance with section 286-111. 15 16 (i) This section shall not apply to the licensing of: 17 An emancipated minor; and (1)18 Motorcycle or motor scooter drivers. (2) 19 For the purposes of this section, "household member" (i) 20 shall have the same meaning as defined in section 291E-1. 21 Notwithstanding any other provisions, for the purposes (k)

of this section, the district court and family court shall

- 1 notify the driver's license examiner of all persons under the
- age of eighteen who have pending violations or proceedings that 2
- 3 might result in the suspension or revocation of the provisional
- license, and any pending adjudication of an offense relating to 4
- 5 the operation of a motor vehicle."
- 6 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
