A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 178, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 2005, appropriated a total of \$10,000,000 for
- 3 fiscal year 2005-2006 from the state highway fund to the city
- 4 and county of Honolulu (\$4,000,000), the county of Hawaii
- 5 (\$2,000,000), the county of Maui (\$2,000,000), and the county of
- 6 Kauai (\$2,000,000), as subsidies for county road work. The
- 7 legislature also finds that section 248-9, Hawaii Revised
- 8 Statutes, authorizes the use of state highway fund moneys only
- 9 for the state highway system. It does not authorize the use of
- 10 such moneys for the road systems of the counties.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the use of moneys
- 12 from the state highway fund for the road systems of the counties
- 13 for fiscal year 2005-2006.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 248-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$248-9 State highway fund. (a) Moneys in the state
- 17 highway fund may be expended for the following purposes:

1	(1)	To pay the costs of operation, maintenance, and repair
2		of the state highway system, including without
3		limitation, the cost of equipment and general
4		administrative overhead;
5	(2)	To pay the costs of acquisition (including real
6		property and interests therein), planning, designing,
7		construction and reconstruction of the state highway
8		system, and bikeways, including, without limitation,
9		the cost of equipment and general administrative
10		overhead; [and]
11	(3)	To reimburse the general fund for interest on and
12		principal of general obligation bonds issued to
13		finance highway projects where the bonds are
14		designated to be reimbursable out of the state highway
15		fund[-]; and
16	(4)	To pay the costs of construction, maintenance, and
17		repair of county roads; provided that none of the
18		funds expended on a county road or program shall be
19		federal funds when such expenditure would cause a
20		violation of federal law or a federal grant agreement.
21	<u>(b)</u>	At any time the director of transportation may
22	transfer	from the state highway fund all or any portion of

- 1 available moneys determined by the director of transportation to
 2 be in excess of one hundred thirty-five per cent of the
- 3 requirements for the ensuing twelve months for the state highway
- 4 fund as permitted by and in accordance with section 37-53. For
- 5 purposes of the determination, the director of transportation
- 6 shall take into consideration:
- 7 (1) The amount of federal funds and bond funds on deposit
 8 in, and budgeted to be expended from, the state
 9 highway fund during the period;
- 10 (2) Amounts on deposit in the state highway fund which are encumbered or otherwise obligated;
- 12 (3) Budgeted amounts payable from the state highway fund during the period;
- 14 (4) Revenues anticipated to be received by and
 15 expenditures to be made from the state highway fund
 16 during the period based on existing agreements and
 17 other information for the ensuing twelve months; and
- 18 (5) Any other factors as the director of transportation19 shall deem appropriate."
- 20 SECTION 3. It is the intent of this Act not to jeopardize 21 the receipt of any federal aid nor to impair the obligation of 22 the State or any agency thereof to the holders of any bond

- 1 issued by the State or any such agency, and to the extent, and
- 2 only to the extent, necessary to effectuate this intent, the
- 3 governor may modify the strict provisions of this Act, but shall
- 4 promptly report any such modification with reasons therefor to
- 5 the legislature at its next session thereafter for review by the
- 6 legislature.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
