A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 846-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Criminal history record check" means a search by name
- 5 using the state computerized criminal history record information
- 6 system, and by fingerprints using the state automated
- 7 fingerprint identification system.
- 8 "Criminal history record name inquiry" means a search by
- 9 name and other identifying information using the state
- 10 computerized criminal history record information system."
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 846-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "§846-10.5 Fees. (a) Except for services provided to
- 14 criminal justice agencies and state or county agencies for
- 15 employment purposes, the Hawaii criminal justice data center and
- 16 state and county criminal justice agencies shall assess the
- 17 following fees for services provided or to be provided, which

1	shall be	deposited into the criminal history record improvement
2	revolving	fund:
3	(1)	For each criminal history record [name] check[7] or
4		criminal history record name inquiry conducted by the
5		data center[7] and other state and county agencies,
6		[\$15;] <u>\$20;</u>
7	(2)	For each criminal history record name [check,] inquiry
8		via [a public access terminal,] an electronic database
9		maintained by the data center that is accessible to
10		users through an interactive computer-based system,
11		for which a <u>certified</u> printout is requested, \$10 per
12		printout;
13	[(3)	For each fingerprint based search of the automated
14		fingerprint identification system or manual
15		fingerprint files, \$25;
16	(4)]	(3) For processing of each application for the
17		expungement of arrest records, \$25;
18	[-(5) -]	(4) For certification of documents, \$10 per document;
19	[-(6) -]	(5) For each duplicate expungement certificate
20		requested, \$15; and
21	[-(7)-]	(6) For each complete set of fingerprints taken, \$15.

- (b) Criminal history record checks mandated for child care
- 2 facilities shall be exempt from the requirement to pay fees.
- 3 (c) Nonprofit charitable organizations that are tax-exempt
- 4 under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) shall be exempt
- 5 from fees for criminal history record checks conducted on adult
- 6 volunteers having direct contact with minors[-], the elderly, or
- 7 the disabled.
- 8 (d) Any other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the
- 9 data center may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to establish
- 10 reasonable fees for services provided by the data center and to
- 11 establish other exemptions from the requirement to pay fees."
- 12 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
