A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish an 1 office of international affairs to coordinate and promote 2 economic, social, cultural, and scientific relations with other 3 countries. 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 6 and to read as follows: 7 Office of international affairs; established. 8 "§201-(a) There is established, within the department of business, 9 economic development, and tourism, an office of international 10 affairs. 11 (b) The office shall: 12 Develop policies that promote and strengthen relations 13 (1)with other countries in the areas of international 14 business, economy, culture, and the arts; 15 Develop policies that promote transportation between, (2) 16 and tourism with, other countries; 17

- 6 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
