A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 2 3 to read as follows: . ARSON 4 "PART Arson in the first degree. (1) A person commits §708-5 the offense of arson in the first degree if the person 6 intentionally or knowingly sets fire to or causes to be burned 7 8 property and: Knowingly places another person in danger of death or 9 (a) bodily injury; or 10 Knowingly or recklessly damages the property of 11 (b) another, without the other's consent, in an amount 12 exceeding \$20,000. 13 (2) Arson in the first degree is a class A felony. 14 Arson in the second degree. - 1 SECTION 2. Section 708-800, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending the definition of "widely dangerous means"
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 ""Widely dangerous means" includes explosion, [fire,]
- 5 flood, avalanche, collapse of building, poison gas, radioactive
- 6 material, or any other material, substance, force, or means
- 7 capable of causing potential widespread injury or damage."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 708-820, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "§708-820 Criminal property damage in the first degree.
- 11 (1) A person commits the offense of criminal property damage in
- 12 the first degree if [+] by means other than fire:
- 13 (a) The person intentionally or knowingly damages property
- and thereby recklessly places another person in danger
- of death or bodily injury; or
- 16 (b) The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
- property of another, without the other's consent, in
- an amount exceeding \$20,000.
- 19 (2) Criminal property damage in the first degree is a
- 20 class B felony."
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 708-821, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

17	(a)	The person recklessly damages the property of another,						
18		without the other's consent, by the use of widely						
19		dangerous means; or						
20	(b)	The person intentionally damages the property of						

another, without the other's consent, in an amount

exceeding \$500.

(2) Criminal property damage in the third degree is a 1 2 misdemeanor." SECTION 6. Section 708-823, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 "§708-823 Criminal property damage in the fourth degree. 5 A person commits the offense of criminal property damage in 6 (1)the fourth degree if by means other than fire, the person 7 intentionally damages the property of another without the 8 9 other's consent. (2) Criminal property damage in the fourth degree is a 10 petty misdemeanor." 11 SECTION 7. Section 708-823.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows: 13 "(1) A person commits the offense of aggravated criminal 14 property damage if the person[+] by means other than fire: 15 Intentionally damages the property of another without 16 (a) the other's consent; and 17 Has been convicted two or more times of an offense 18 (b)

under section 708-822 or 708-823 in the preceding five

years."

- 1 SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun, before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
