A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR DENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that inadequate dental
- 2 care is a serious matter and has been identified as one of the
- 3 major health concerns for low-income adults and children, people
- 4 with developmental disabilities, and the uninsured. These
- 5 individuals continually face great challenges in accessing
- 6 dental care services in an appropriate and timely manner. The
- 7 lack of dental care for this population is profound and
- 8 unacceptable.
- 9 The legislature further finds that federally qualified
- 10 health centers are the appropriate and most efficient entities
- 11 to establish community-based dental clinics statewide that will
- 12 provide a continuum of dental care based on best practices for
- 13 QUEST-eligible adults and children, people with developmental
- 14 disabilities, and the uninsured.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to increase the State's ability
- 16 to address the dental-health crisis it faces regarding
- 17 QUEST-eligible adults and children, people with developmental
- 18 disabilities, and the uninsured by:

1	(1)	Appropriating runds for the department of hearth to
2		contract with federally qualified health centers to
3		help the greatest number of individuals who need
4		dental care and maximizing the potential for this
5		assistance by minimizing administrative costs; and
6	(2)	Allowing greater flexibility in the provision of this
7		care by establishing community-based dental health
8		clinics that are operated by federally qualified
9		health centers or other community-based organizations.
10	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
11	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$90,000 or so much
12	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for:
13	(1)	A school of dentistry accredited by the American
14		Dental Association to perform an assessment of the
15		status of the continuum of dental care; and
16	(2)	Equipment and service delivery to establish community-
17		based dental health clinics operated by federally
18		qualified health centers or other community-based
19		organizations to provide a continuum of dental care to
20		QUEST-eligible adults and children, people with
21		developmental disabilities, and the uninsured.

1	SECTION 3. The continuum of dental care shall consist o		
2	but not be limited to:		
3	(1)	A lead primary care dentist who is trained by an	
4		accredited dental school in the treatment of	
5		underserved populations and individuals with	
6		disabilities;	
7	(2)	Faculty supervision from dentists of an accredited	
8		dental school to provide appropriate sedation	
9		training; and	
10	(3)	Hospital-based care for anesthesia services.	
11	SECT	ION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the	
12	departmen	t of health for the purposes of this Act.	
13	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
