A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR VIOLATIONS INVOLVING MINORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 281-101.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "S281-101.5 Prohibitions involving minors; penalty. (a)
- 4 [No] Any adult [shall provide or purchase] who provides or
- 5 purchases liquor for consumption or use by a person under
- 6 twenty-one years of age[+] shall be guilty of the offense under
- 7 section 712-1250.5.
- 8 (b) No minor shall purchase liquor and no minor shall
- 9 consume or have liquor in the minor's possession or custody [in
- 10 any motor vehicle on a public highway or] in any public place,
- 11 public gathering, or public amusement $[ex]_{\underline{r}}$ at any public beach
- or public park[+], or in any motor vehicle on a public highway;
- 13 provided that notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
- 14 this subsection shall not apply to:
- 15 (1) Possession or custody of liquor by a minor in the
- 16 course of delivery, pursuant to the direction of the
- minor's employer lawfully engaged in business
- necessitating the delivery;

1	(2)	Possession or custody of liquor by a minor in
2		connection with the minor's authorized participation
3		in religious ceremonies requiring the possession or
4		custody; or

- Any person between the ages of eighteen and twenty,

 who is participating in a controlled purchase as part

 of a law enforcement activity or a study authorized by

 the department of health to determine the level of

 incidence of liquor sales to minors.
- (c) No minor shall falsify any identification or use any false identification or identification of another person or of a fictitious person for the purpose of buying or attempting to buy liquor or for the purpose of obtaining employment to sell or serve liquor on licensed premises.
- Any person under age eighteen who violates this 15 section shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the family 16 [Any person age eighteen or older who violates 17 subsection (a) shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.] Any person 18 age eighteen to twenty-one who violates [subsections] subsection 19 (b) or (c) shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. The court 20 shall order that any person under twenty-one years of age found 21 to be in violation of this section shall have, in addition to 22

1	any other	disposition or sentencing provision permitted by law,
2	the person	's license to operate a motor vehicle, or the person's
3	ability to	obtain a license to operate a motor vehicle,
4	suspended	as follows:
5	(1)	For licensed drivers, the driver's license shall be
6		suspended for not less than one hundred and eighty
7		days with exceptions to allow, at the discretion of
8		the sentencing court, driving to and from school,
9		school-sponsored activities, and employment;
10	<u>(2)</u>	For persons with a provisional license, the
11		provisional license shall be suspended for not less
12		than one hundred and eighty days with exceptions to
13		allow, at the discretion of the sentencing court,
14		driving to and from school, school-sponsored
15		activities, and employment;
16	<u>(3)</u>	For persons with an instruction permit, the
17		instruction permit shall be suspended for not less
18		than one hundred and eighty days with exceptions to
19		allow, at the discretion of the sentencing court,
20		driving to and from school, school-sponsored
21		activities, and employment; or

1	(4)	For persons not licensed to drive, eligibility to
2		obtain a driver's license, provisional license, or
3		instruction permit shall be suspended until the age of
4		seventeen or for one hundred and eighty days, at the
5		discretion of the court; and
6	(5)	Chapter 571 notwithstanding, in any case where a
7		person under the age of eighteen violates this
8		section, the family court judge may suspend the
9		driver's license, provisional license, or instruction
10		permit, or suspend the eligibility to obtain a
11		driver's license, provisional license, or instruction
12		permit in accordance with this section;
13	provided	that the requirement to provide proof of financial
14	responsit	oility pursuant to section 287-20 shall not be based
15	upon a se	entence imposed under paragraphs (1) and (2). In
16	addition,	, all persons whether or not licensed, found to be in
17	violation	n of this section shall be sentenced to seventy-five
18	hours of	community service work, and an eight to twelve hour
19	program o	of alcohol education and counseling the costs of which
20	shall be	borne by the offender or the offender's parent or
21	guardian	_ "

12	(b)	Permits a person to possess intoxicating liquor while
13		on property under his control, and the person
14		possessing the intoxicating liquor is a [minor.]

9		that the [minor] person under the age of twenty-one
10		had attained the age of twenty-one; [or]
11	(d)	The defendant provided the intoxicating liquor to the
12		[minor] person under the age of twenty-one with the
13		express consent of the parent or legal guardian and
14		with the belief, which was reasonable under the
15		circumstances, that the [minor] person under the age
16		of twenty-one would not consume any portion of the

18	(e)	The defendant provided the intoxicating liquor to the
19		[minor] person under the age of twenty-one with the
20		express consent of the parent or legal guardian and
21		with the belief, which was reasonable under the
22		circumstances, that the [minor] person under the age
