A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. After extensive deliberations, the interagency 1 working group, which was established pursuant to part VIII of 2 Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004 (Act 51), the "Reinventing 3 Education Act of 2004," has recommended to the legislature that 4 the transfer of functions from the department of budget and 5 finance, the department of the attorney general, and the 6 department of human services to the department of education 7 specified in Act 51 be repealed. The working group also 8 recommended that the transfer of functions from the department 9 of health to the department of education specified in Act 51 be 10 delayed one year and take effect July 1, 2007, rather than 11 July 1, 2006. 12 The interagency working group recommended to the 2006 13 regular session of the legislature that fiscal functions should 14 remain with the department of budget and finance. The working 15 group reported that the departments of education and budget and 16

finance have agreed to improve the:

- (1) Processes related to capital improvement project
 allotments;
- 3 (2) Fiscal processes affecting the calculation of employee4 benefits; and
- 5 (3) Expenditures of federal funds.
- 6 The departments will work together to prepare memorandums or
- 7 memorandums of understanding to set forth the new processes,
- 8 mutually agreed upon, between the two departments.
- 9 The interagency working group also recommended against
- 10 transferring the functions relating to workers' compensation and
- 11 labor-management relations from the department of the attorney
- 12 general to the department of education at this time. Instead,
- 13 the departments shall prepare memorandums of agreement or
- 14 service level agreements that clarify the scope of relevant
- 15 responsibilities, procedures, and protocols for the respective
- 16 departments.
- 17 The working group noted that the department of education is
- 18 required by statute to conduct criminal history record checks on
- 19 employees that work in close proximity to children. Therefore,
- 20 it is not necessary that the department of human services
- 21 perform this service for the department of education.

remain committed to continuous improvement and that the 1 memorandums, memorandums of understanding, and service level 2 agreements, when completed and implemented in accordance with 3 the departments' agreements, are a critical step toward 4 improving the educational system for our community. 5 Therefore, based on the interagency working group's 6 recommendations contained in its report to the 2006 regular 7 session of the legislature, the purpose of this Act is to amend 8 Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, to reflect some of those 9 10 recommendations. SECTION 2. Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, is amended 11 by amending sections 47 and 48 to read as follows: 12 "SECTION 47. (a) All the rights, powers, functions, 13 duties, and resources of: 14 The department of budget and finance relating to the: 15 (1)Funding of collective bargaining agreement (A) 16 increases; and 17 Securing, administering use, and expending of 18 (B) federal funds and other aid, including their 19 custodial supervision; and 20 [(2) The department of the attorney general relating to: 21
