A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A COMMISSION ON FATHERHOOD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 156 Session Laws of Hawaii 2003, as amended 1

by Act 148, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is amended by amending 2

section 2 to read as follows: 3

"SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 4

adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 5

6 as follows:

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"CHAPTER

COMMISSION ON FATHERHOOD

-1 Findings and purpose. The legislature finds that, 9

across the United States, there is a renewed understanding of

the unique importance of fathers in the lives of their children, 11

families, and communities. It is widely recognized that 12

children are more likely to thrive with support, guidance, and 13

nurturing from both parents. The absence of one parent from a 14

child's life can place that child at a greater risk of health, 15

emotional, educational, and behavioral problems associated with 16

the child's development. However, many young men today are 17

themselves fatherless, lack appropriate role models, and are in 18

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- 1 need of information and education regarding the appropriate
- 2 roles and responsibilities of fathers.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the role of fathers in
- 4 the raising of children and in the health and well-being of
- 5 families is often unintentionally overlooked in government
- 6 contracts, programs, and services dealing with children's
- 7 health, welfare, and education.
- 8 It is the purpose of this chapter to provide for a
- 9 statewide program to promote healthy family relationships
- 10 between parents and children.
- 11 § -2 State commission on fatherhood. There is
- 12 established the state commission on fatherhood within the
- 13 department of human services for administrative purposes.
- 14 § -3 Members; terms; chair; quorum; compensation. (a)
- 15 The commission shall consist of fifteen members and reflect the
- 16 geographic and cultural diversity of the State. The membership
- 17 shall include:
- 18 (1) Ex officio, the director of human services,
- 19 superintendent of education, director of health,
- 20 attorney general, [director of the office of children
- 21 and youth, director of public safety, and executive

1		director of the office of youth services, or their
2		designees; and
3	(2)	Eight voting members shall be appointed by the
4		governor as provided in section 26-34, except as
5		otherwise provided in this section, as follows:
6		(A) Two members shall be appointed by the governor
7		from a list of three nominees submitted by the
8		president of the senate, and two members shall be
9		appointed by the governor from a list of three
10		nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
11		representatives; and
12		(B) Four members shall be appointed by the governor
13		from the community.
14	(3)	One voting member shall be designated by the Hawaii
15		Coalition for Dads.
16	(b)	Of the appointed members, there shall be at least one
17	member fro	om each of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii.
18	(c)	All members shall serve for a term of two years. Any
19	vacancies	occurring in the membership of the commission shall be
20	filled for	r the remainder of the unexpired term in the same

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manner as the original appointments.

1	(d) The chair	and vice chair of the board shall be
2	selected annually f	rom the nongovernmental members of the
3	commission appointe	ed pursuant to subsection (a)(2). A simple
4	majority shall cons	titute a quorum, whose affirmative vote shall
5	be necessary for al	l actions.
6	(e) The member	ers shall serve without compensation.
7	(f) Any membe	er of the commission shall be immune from
8	civil liability as	provided in section 26-35.5.
9	§ -4 Duties	The commission shall serve in an advisory
10	capacity to state a	agencies to promote healthy family
11	relationships betwe	een parents and children. In addition, the
12	commission may make	e recommendations on programs, services, and
13	contracts relating	to children and families, and may:
14	(1) Act as a	central clearinghouse and coordinating body
15	for gove:	rnmental and nongovernmental activities and
16	informat	ion relating to the promotion of healthy
17	families	;
18	(2) Identify	promising best practices that support and
19	engage bo	oth parents in the emotional and financial
20	support (of their children;

(3) Identify obstacles that impede or prevent the

involvement of fathers in the lives of their children;

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1	(4)	Raise public awareness of the consequences that the
2		absence of the father may cause in a child's life;
3	(5)	Recommend policies and practices, both within and
4		without state government, that sustain and reengage
5		fathers in the lives of their children;
6	(6)	Promote, foster, encourage, and otherwise support
7		programs designed to educate and train young men who
8		are both current and future fathers as to effective
9		parenting skills, behaviors, and attitudes;
10	(7)	Promote, foster, encourage, and otherwise support
11		programs that promote fatherhood;
12	(8)	Promote, foster, encourage, and otherwise support
13		programs that counter poverty and low income by
14		increasing the capacity of fathers to overcome
15		personal challenges and become productive,
16		independent, and financially responsible contributors
17		to their family; and
18	(9)	Do any and all things necessary to carry out its
19		duties and the purposes of this chapter.
20	\$	-5 Meetings. The meetings of the commission shall be
21	subject t	o the requirements of chapter 92.

- 1 § -6 Exemption from administrative supervision of boards
- 2 and commissions. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
- 3 commission shall be exempt from section 26-35 with the exception
- 4 of section 26-35(2), (3), (7), and (8).
- 5 § -7 Administration of funds. The commission shall
- 6 administer funds appropriated or allocated for its work and
- 7 shall be authorized to accept, disburse, and allocate funds that
- 8 may become available from other governmental and private
- 9 sources; provided that all such funds shall be disbursed or
- 10 allocated in compliance with any specific designation stated by
- 11 the donor and, in the absence of any specific designation, the
- 12 funds shall be disbursed or allocated on projects related to any
- 13 of the purposes of this chapter.""
- 14 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
