A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§353- Reports to county clerk. Whenever the paroling
5	authority grants or revokes parole for any citizen of eighteen
6	years of age or over, the paroling authority, in each case,
7	shall make and promptly transmit to the clerk of the county in
8	which the citizen resides, a certificate showing the fact of the
9	granting or revoking of parole within twenty days after the
10	granting or revoking of parole. The certificate shall include:
11	(1) The name, date of birth, and social security number of
12	the citizen and any known aliases;
13	(2) The citizen's address or last known address; and
14	(3) The date of the grant or revocation of parole."
15	SECTION 2. Section 806-76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to read as follows:

         SECTION 3. Section 831-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
