A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\\$291- Reimbursement to counties. The State shall
- 5 reimburse the counties for the unit cost of issuing a removable
- 6 windshield placard or a temporary removable windshield placard
- 7 on behalf of the State. Beginning July 1, 2006, the rate of the
- 8 per unit cost reimbursement shall be \$12."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 291-51.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "\$291-51.6 Issuance of temporary removable windshield
- 12 parking placards. Each county [may] shall issue one temporary
- 13 removable windshield placard and a second temporary removable
- 14 windshield placard to each applicant who requests and presents a
- 15 certificate of disability that verifies the duration of the
- 16 applicant's disability in monthly increments, which shall not
- 17 exceed six months, and upon payment of a fee to the issuing
- 18 agency. The temporary removable windshield placard shall be

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- 1 designed, fabricated, and sold to the counties at a rate
- 2 negotiated by the disability and communication access board."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 291-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "§291-52 Issuance of removable windshield placard. Each
- 6 county [may] shall issue one removable windshield placard and a
- 7 second removable windshield placard to each applicant who so
- 8 requests and presents a certificate of disability that verifies
- 9 that the applicant's disability is expected to last for at least
- 10 four years. The removable windshield placard shall expire four
- 11 years after the date of its issuance. The removable windshield
- 12 placard shall be designed, fabricated, and sold to the counties
- 13 at a rate negotiated by the disability and communication access
- 14 board."
- 15 SECTION 4. Section 291-52.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "§291-52.6 Replacement of a lost, stolen, or mutilated
- 18 placard or identification card. A removable windshield placard,
- 19 temporary removable windshield placard, or identification card
- 20 that is reported lost, stolen, or mutilated [may] shall be
- 21 replaced upon the submittal of a written statement by a person
- 22 with a disability that the placard or identification card was

- 1 either lost, stolen, or mutilated and a completed application
- 2 for a removable windshield placard, temporary removable
- 3 windshield placard, or identification card to the issuing
- 4 agency."
- 5 SECTION 5. Section 291-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "§291-56 Rules. The disability and communication access
- 8 board [may] shall adopt rules under chapter 91 to carry out the
- 9 purposes of this part, including rules for:
- 10 (1) The issuance, renewal, confiscation, revocation, and
- 11 suspension of removable windshield placards, temporary
- removable windshield placards, and special license
- 13 plates;
- 14 (2) Decertification, reciprocity, and the replacement of
- placards and identification cards;
- 16 (3) The design of the placard, identification card, and
- 17 special license plates;
- 18 (4) The establishment of fees for placards;
- 19 (5) Signage and marking of parking spaces; and
- 20 (6) Penalties."
- 21 SECTION 6. The state auditor is directed to conduct an
- 22 analysis of the cost to the State of reimbursing the counties

- 1 for issuing removable and temporary windshield placards as
- provided under section 1 of this Act.
- 3 The state auditor shall report findings and recommendations
- 4 to the legislature no later than twenty days before the
- 5 convening of the regular session of 2007.
- 6 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$51,190 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 to assist
- 9 in implementing the purposes of this Act.
- The sum appropriated shall constitute the State's share of
- 11 the cost of mandated programs under article VIII, section 5 of
- 12 the State Constitution.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 health's disability and communication access board.
- 15 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
