A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Research indicates that teacher quality is one
- of the most influential factors in student achievement. 2
- Standards-based reform has a greater chance of success when 3
- teacher quality is addressed. In an effort to provide quality 4
- education for its students, the department of education 5
- continues to recruit highly-qualified teachers within the State 6
- of Hawaii and from the continental United States. However, as 7
- more "baby-boom" teachers in Hawaii and across the nation 8
- retire, the task of recruiting highly-qualified teachers is 9
- becoming more challenging each year. Consequently, finding 10
- sufficient numbers of highly-qualified teachers for shortage 11
- areas is becoming more difficult, and teacher shortages are only 12
- expected to grow as more "baby-boom" teachers retire through the 13
- remainder of the decade. 14
- SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15
- amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately 16
- designated and to read as follows: 17

- 1 shall not earn retirement service credit, contribute to the
- 2 retirement system, or gain additional retirement system benefits
- 3 as a result of the teacher or administrator's employment;
- 4 provided that the retired teacher or administrator shall
- 5 continue to be entitled to the teacher or administrator's
- 6 regular retirement benefits without penalty.
- 7 (c) To qualify for full-time rehiring under this section,
- 8 the person shall have been retired for at least one calendar
- 9 year prior to reemployment."
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006, and
