## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIMU MANAGEMENT AREA.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the natural supply
- 2 of limu along the shores in Ewa beach is rapidly diminishing.
- 3 This is due in part to overharvesting of limu during the past
- 4 four years. As a result, many types of limu, including huluhulu
- 5 waenae, lipoa, and 'a'ala 'ula, can no longer be found or are at
- 6 risk of extinction in this area.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to preserve and sustain the limu
- 8 supply by establishing a limu management area along the
- 9 shoreline of Ewa beach on Oahu.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "\$188- Limu management area. (a) There is established
- 14 a limu management area from the shoreline and extending one
- 15 hundred fifty feet seaward in Ewa beach from the gunnery range
- 16 to the boat ramp on Muumuu street.
- 17 (b) No person, including a person with a commercial
- 18 fishing license, shall pick, gather, harvest, or otherwise take

- 1 limu from within the limu management area beginning no sooner
- 2 than January 1, 2007; provided that this section shall not apply
- 3 to a person who has obtained a special permit to pick limu for
- 4 purposes of replanting.
- 5 (c) Beginning no sooner than January 1, 2010, a person,
- 6 including a person with a commercial fishing license, may hand-
- 7 pick limu in the limu management area from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00
- 8 p.m., only during the months of July, November, and December of
- 9 each year. A maximum of one pound for all types of limu
- 10 combined may be hand-picked per day by any person, including any
- 11 person possessing a commercial fishing license.
- 12 (d) This section shall not apply to any person exercising
- 13 native Hawaiian gathering rights and traditional cultural
- 14 practices as authorized by law or as permitted by the department
- of land and natural resources pursuant to Article XII, Section 7
- 16 of the Hawaii State Constitution.
- 17 (e) The department of land and natural resources shall
- 18 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of
- 19 this section."
- 20 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
- 22 2006.
