A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Hawaii is home to two of the world's premier
2	astronomy observatories, Haleakala on Maui and Mauna Kea on
3	Hawaii. Mauna Kea is considered the finest observation site in
4	the world. One of the most critical ways to preserve the value
5	of these sites is to reduce bright sources of light that
6	penetrate the dark night sky. Recent nighttime images from the
7	international space station revealed that some of the brightest
8	sources of light on Maui and Hawaii are the airports and harbors
9	on both islands. Astronomers on Mauna Kea are now detecting
10	artificial light sources from urban areas that are diminishing
11	the telescopes' ability to do research.
12	The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
13	transportation, to the extent that is practical:
14	(1) To comply with county ordinances and standards
15	relating to outside lighting at airports, harbors, and
16	highways; and

1	(2) To provide cut-off or fully shielded lens fixtures to
2	direct artificial lighting downward and not diffused
3	into the atmosphere.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 262, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
6	and to read as follows:
7	" <u>§262-</u> Outdoor lighting. (a) To the extent that it is
8	practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or
9	federal law, regulation, or mandate, in the event that any
10	airport regulations or standards relating to outdoor lighting on
11	runways, ramp or apron areas, roadways, and parking lots are in
12	conflict with any county ordinance or other regulations
13	regarding the same areas, the more stringent requirement or
14	standard shall govern.
15	(b) Outdoor lighting in ramp or apron areas, parking lots,
16	and roadways shall be equipped with fully shielded lens fixtures
17	directing the lighting downward.
18	(c) Where airport operations cease at night, the
19	department shall minimize outdoor lighting to the minimum level
20	necessary for safety and security."

         "§266- Outdoor lighting. (a) To the extent that it is

    harbor regulations or standards relating to outdoor lighting at

    any harbor facility conflict with any county ordinance or other

Description:

Requires DOT, to the extent practicable, to comply with county outdoor lighting ordinances (if they are more stringent) at airports, harbors, and highways and to provide fully shielded lens fixtures on all outdoor lighting fixtures. (HB1835 HD1)
