A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. Research indicates that teacher quality is one |

| 3 | Standards-based reform has a greater chance of success when |
| 4 | teacher quality is raised. In an effort to provide quality |
| 5 | education for its students, the department of education |
| 6 | continues to recruit highly qualified teachers within the State |
| 7 | of Hawaii and from the continental United States. As more "baby |
| 8 | boom" teachers in Hawaii and across the nation retire, the task |
| 9 | of recruiting highly qualified teachers is becoming more |
| 10 | challenging each year. Consequently, finding sufficient numbers |
| 11 | of highly qualified teachers for shortage areas is becoming more |
| 12 | difficult, and teacher shortages are expected to grow as more |
| 13 | "baby boom" teachers retire through the remainder of the decade. |
| 14 | SECTION 2. Beginning July 1, 2006, the department of |
| 15 | education and charter schools may employ retired licensed |
| 16 | teachers at up to one hundred per cent full-time equivalency to |
| 17 | teach in teacher shortage areas identified by the department of |
| 18 | education or charter schools and to serve as mentors for new |

- 1 classroom teachers, with the prior approval of the
- 2 superintendent of education or the local school board of each
- 3 charter school and pursuant to collective bargaining agreements.
- 4 The provisions of sections 88-21, 88-42.5, 88-43, 88-45, and 88-
- 5 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and any other statute to the
- $\mathbf{6}$ contrary notwithstanding, retired licensed teachers who are
- 7 hired under this section shall not earn retirement service
- 8 credit, contribute to the retirement system, or gain additional
- 9 retirement system benefits as a result of their employment;
- 10 provided that retired licensed teachers shall continue to
- 11 receive entitled normal retirement benefits without penalty. To
- 12 qualify for full-time employment, the retired licensed teacher
- 13 shall be retired for at least one calendar year prior to
- 14 reemployment to teach or serve as a mentor.
- SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006, and
- 16 shall be repealed on July 1, 2011.
