### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1  | SECTION 1. Today's globalized society presents abundant          |
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| 2  | opportunities for information and technology exchange and        |
| 3  | research development and dissemination. Many international       |
| 4  | agencies, universities, and organizations already provide proven |
| 5  | frameworks for international cooperation and information         |
| 6  | exchange. For example, the International Energy Agency is a      |
| 7  | forum for twenty-six industrialized countries that have agreed   |
| 8  | to share energy information, coordinate energy policies, and     |
| 9  | cooperate in the development of rational energy programs, such   |
| 10 | as the deployment of ocean energy technologies. It is clearly    |
| 11 | in the best interests of the people of Hawaii for this State to  |
| 12 | actively participate in these global networks. Hawaii is also    |
| 13 | uniquely situated to emerge as a leader in the Pacific basin in  |
| 14 | this regard.   |
| 15 | The purpose of this Act is to require the department of          |
| 16 | business, economic development, and tourism to: (1) work with    |
| 17 | international agencies, universities, and organizations and      |
| 18 | coordinate the State's involvement in national and international |

| 1  | efforts to promote, investigate, and develop the use of          |
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| 2  | renewable energy resources, including renewable ocean resources, |
| 3  | and (2) promote the State as an active participant and leader in |
| 4  | renewable energy development and research in the Pacific basin.  |
| 5  | SECTION 2. Section 201-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is            |
| 6  | amended to read as follows:                                      |
| 7  | "§201-3 Specific research and promotional functions of the       |
| 8  | department. Without prejudice to its general functions and       |
| 9  | duties the department of business, economic development, and     |
| 10 | tourism shall have specific functions in the following areas:    |
| 11 | (1) Industrial development. The department shall                 |
| 12 | determine through technical and economic surveys the             |
| 13 | profit potential of new or expanded industrial                   |
| 14 | undertakings; develop through research projects and              |
| 15 | other means new and improved industrial products and             |
| 16 | processes; promote studies and surveys to determine              |
| 17 | consumer preference as to design and quality and to              |
| 18 | determine the best methods of packaging, transporting            |
| 19 | and marketing the State's industrial products;                   |
| 20 | disseminate information to assist the present                    |
| 21 | industries of the State, to attract new industries to            |
| 22 | the State, and to encourage capital investment in                |

| 14 |     | and most productive use of the lands in the State; and |
| 15 |     | make such grants or contracts as may be necessary or   |
| 16 |     | advisable to accomplish the foregoing;                 |
| 17 | (3) | Credit development. The department shall conduct a     |
| 18 |     | continuing study of agricultural and industrial credit |
| 19 |     | needs; encourage the development of additional private |
| 20 |     | and public credit sources for agricultural and         |
| 21 |     | industrial enterprises; promote an informational       |
| 22 |     | program to acquaint financial institutions with        |

| 7  | (4) | Promotion. The department shall disseminate            |

| 10 |     | industry in the State, attract new industry and        |
| 11 |     | investments to the State, and assist new and emerging  |
| 12 |     | industry with good growth potential or prospects in    |
| 13 |     | jobs, exports, and new products. The industrial and    |
| 14 |     | economic promotional activities of the department may  |
| 15 |     | include the use of literature, advertising,            |
| 16 |     | demonstrations, displays, market testing, lectures,    |
