A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC SAFETY AT PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. There are many hazardous traffic conditions 2 that exist at Hawaii's public schools, particularly during the 3 morning when students are dropped off at school and in the 4 afternoon when students are picked up from school. These safety 5 hazards are compounded when egress and ingress at the schools is slow and frustrating for parents, as well as the faculty and 6 7 students who attempt to find parking at the same time. 8 instances where students have to walk through a parking lot or 9 congested areas to get to school, the traffic flow is further 10 disrupted, resulting in a dangerous traffic environment. Often, 11 there are not enough school security aides or safety managers to 12 supervise and control the situation, as they are pressed with 13 other duties. Moreover, poor planning and uncoordinated efforts 14 have often hampered attempts to mitigate these traffic hazards. 15 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 16 education to conduct a traffic study and develop a plan to decrease hazardous traffic conditions at all public schools. 17

2	a traffic flow study of hazardous traffic conditions at all
3	public schools in the State. The study shall include a review
4	of hazardous conditions relating to parking, drop off areas,
5	pick up areas, ingress and egress, and pedestrian safety at
6	schools. The study shall include other factors the department
7	of education deems appropriate and relevant to decrease safety
8	hazards, with regard to individual schools, such as:
9	(1) Surrounding communities affected by the school;
10	(2) Population densities and growth of those communities;
11	(3) Existing patterns and trends in traffic flows and
12	densities;
13	(4) Peak capacities of surrounding roads and feeder
14	highways around the affected school; and
15	(5) Any other factors the superintendent deems relevant.
16	The study shall include the recommendations and input of
17	concerned neighbors, parents, faculty, and students. The
18	superintendent shall submit a written report of findings and
19	recommendations to the governor and legislature no later than
20	December 31, 2006, including any necessary proposed legislation
21	to implement the study's recommendations.

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
- 4 a comprehensive study of hazardous traffic conditions near all
- 5 of Hawaii's public schools and to develop a plan to decrease
- 6 traffic safety hazards.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
- 10 provided that section 2 shall take effect July 1, 2006.
