### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

14		read on May 5, 2004, and sections 40-1, 40-4, and
15		40-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in
16		the form in which they read on June 30, 1986; and
17	(3)	Section 9 shall take effect on July 1, 2004."

Extends the sunset date to June 30, 2010, of provisions:
Granting the Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) the authority to
retain attorneys independent of the Attorney General; exempting
HTA's accounts from supervision by the Comptroller; granting HTA
the authority to appoint a sports coordinator; establishing that
all interest and revenues or receipts derived by HTA from
projects shall be deposited into the Tourism Special Fund (TSF);
specifying that 5 percent of TSF funds may be used for
administrative expenses; and certain other provisions. (HB1923
