A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow home school				
2	students who would otherwise be denied the opportunity to do so,				
3	to participate on an equal basis in extracurricular and				
4	interscholastic activities. This Act is not intended to				
5	sanction or encourage the recruitment of students for				
6	participation in these activities by public schools.				
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated				
9	and to read as follows:				
10	"§302A- Home school students; extracurricular and

8	(b) Each private school may allow a student to participate
9	in an activity offered by the private school, at the private
10	school's discretion.
11	(c) A public school shall not adopt or agree to be bound
12	by any rule or policy of any organization or association that
13	would prohibit any participation allowed by this section.
14	(d) Any home school student may participate in an activity
15	through any amateur association or league of which the public
16	school is not a member, and this participation shall not prevent
17	the student from participating or affect the student's
18	eligibility to participate in the same activity at any public
19	school. Prior to participating in any activity through such an
20	amateur association or league, the home school student shall
21	obtain the express written permission of the principal of the

1	public school at which the student participates in the activity,
2	which permission shall be granted if:
3	(1) The home school student's class attendance is not
4	compromised; and
5	(2) The home school student is in good academic
6	standing under the home school's activities
7	policy.
8	(e) Notwithstanding any rule adopted or agreed to by any
9	public school, any home school student who is sanctioned or is
10	found by the public school, or any organization or association
11	to which the school belongs, to be ineligible to participate in
12	any activity for any reason, except unsportsmanlike conduct or
13	ejection from an activity, may appeal the sanction or finding.
14	The appeal may be made through the applicable process at the
15	school, any league to which the school belongs, or any other
16	organization to which the school belongs.
17	(f) To participate in an activity at a public school, a
18	home school student shall meet all of the requirements imposed
19	by the public school, including compliance with:
20	(1) All laws governing the activity;
21	(2) All eligibility requirements imposed by the
22	<pre>public school;</pre>

1	(3) The same responsibilities and standards of
2	behavior as are imposed on other students
3	participating in the activity at the public
4	school; and
5	(4) The payment of all required activity-related
6	fees, including any fee provided in subsection
7	<u>(g).</u>
8	(g) A public school may charge a home school student
9	participating in an activity a participation fee as a
10	prerequisite to participation. The fee amount that the school
11	charges a home school student shall not exceed one hundred fifty
12	per cent of the fee amount the school would charge an enrolled
13	student to participate in the activity; provided that if any fee
14	is collected pursuant to this subsection for participation in an
15	activity, the fee shall be used to fund the particular activity
16	for which it is charged and shall not be expended for any other
17	purpose.
18	(h) No home school student who participates in an activity
19	in a public school shall be included in the pupil enrollment of
20	the public school where the student participates.
21	(i) As used in this section:

1	"Activity" means any extracurricular or interscholastic				
2	activity, including any academic, artistic, athletic,				
3	recreational, or other activity offered by a school.				
4	<u>"Hom</u>	e school" means the sequential program of instruction			
5	for the e	ducation of a child which:			
6	(1)	Takes place in a home;			
7	(2)	Is provided by the child's parent or guardian or by an			
8		adult relative of the child designated by the parent			
9		or guardian;			
10	(3)	Is not under the supervision and control of a public			
11		school;			
12	(4)	Is not intended to be and does not qualify as a			
13		private and nonprofit school or a new century charter			
14		school; and			
15	(5)	Is subject to any rule adopted by the department of			
16		education under title 8, chapter 12, Hawaii			
17		Administrative Rules ("compulsory attendance			
18		exceptions"), relating to home schooling.			
19	<u>(j)</u>	The department shall adopt rules under chapter 91 to			
20	administe	r and implement this section."

22	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
