### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A LONG-TERM CARE TAX CREDIT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 235, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "\$235- Long-term care tax credit. (a) Each resident 5 individual taxpayer who files an individual income tax return 6 for a taxable year, and who is not claimed or is not otherwise 7 eligible to be claimed as a dependent by another taxpayer for 8 Hawaii state individual income tax purposes, may claim a long-9 term care credit against the resident taxpayer's net individual 10 income tax liability for the taxable year for which the 11 individual's income tax return is being filed; provided that a resident individual who has no income or no income taxable under 12 13 this chapter, and who is not claimed or is not otherwise 14 eligible to be claimed as a dependent by a taxpayer for Hawaii state individual income tax purposes may claim this credit. 15 16 (b) The tax credit shall be an amount equal to the lesser

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    resident individual; and provided further that no refunds or
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    payment on account of the tax credit allowed by this section
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    shall be made for amounts less than $1.
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         (g) All claims, including any amended claims, for tax
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    credits under this section shall be filed on or before the end
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    of the twelfth month following the close of the taxable year for
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    which the credit may be claimed. Failure to comply with the
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    foregoing provision shall constitute a waiver of the right to
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    claim the credit."
