BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 587, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 Foster children's bill of rights. Not 5 withstanding any provision to the contrary, the department has the duty as foster custodian or permanent custodian to ensure 6 that children living under its care have the following rights 7 protected and enforced: 8 9 To be treated with fairness, dignity, respect, and (1)10 without discrimination because of race, color, religion, disability, sexual orientation, national 11 12 origin, age, and gender; To be free from harassment, corporal punishment, 13 (2) unreasonable restraint, and physical, sexual, verbal, 14 15 and emotional abuse; To live in a safe, healthy, and comfortable home; 16 (3)
