## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that individuals have 2 certain constitutional and statutory rights relating to their 3 religious or cultural practices and beliefs. One of these
- 4 practices relates to the individual's disposition of their
- 5 child's placenta (`iewe) following birth.
- 6 The legislature further finds that state policy must be
- 7 amended to allow the department of health to create
- 8 administrative rules assuring that these rights are honored and
- 9 respected.
- 10 According to native Hawaiian religious practices, the
- 11 correct cleansing and disposal of the 'iewe is critical to the
- 12 physical and spiritual health of both the mother and the newborn
- 13 child. At present, hospitals are capable of testing the
- 14 placenta for infectious diseases prior to its release to the
- 15 patient. If the placenta is not infectious or otherwise harmful
- 16 to the public, the State has the obligation to assure that
- 17 religious and cultural beliefs and practices are not impeded by
- 18 a failure to address proper procedures for access.

- SECTION 2. Section 321-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "[+]§321-21[+] Infectious wastes; management and disposal. 3 The department of health shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 4 91 for the management and disposal of infectious wastes 5 generated by hospitals, clinics, other health care facilities, 6 doctors' offices, dentists' offices, research laboratories, 7 veterinary clinics, and other generators of infectious wastes. 8 Upon negative findings of infection or hazard after appropriate 9 testing of a placenta, it may be released by the hospital to the 10 woman from whom it originated or the woman's designated 11 individual. The rules shall include procedures to assure the 12 appropriate handling and transfer of the placenta, and a 13 definition of infectious wastes that clearly and objectively 14 defines infectious wastes and specifies acceptable containers 15 and other factors related to the identification, segregation, 16 containment, and transportation of infectious wastes. Effective 17 July 1, 1991, all generators of infectious wastes shall show 18 proof that infectious wastes are being managed and disposed of 19 according to departmental rules upon request of the department." 20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
