A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that bicycling is growing 1 in importance as a mode of transportation. Bicycling has many 2 3 benefits, including: Improved mobility, especially for those who cannot or 4 (1)choose not to drive; 5 Lower road maintenance costs; 6 (2)(3) Less traffic congestion; 7 Less road widening and fewer parking lots; 8 (4)Improved air quality; and 9 (5)Improved health and reduced medical costs. 10 (6) With rising gasoline prices, many people are looking for an 11 alternative method of transportation. It is far less expensive 12 to operate a bicycle than an automobile. 13 The purpose of this Act is to ensure the implementation of 14 a safe, continuous, and coordinated system of bikeways by 15 earmarking a percentage of the state highway fund for bikeways. 16 SECTION 2. Section 248-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17

21	<u>(b)</u>	At any time, the director of transportation may
22	transfer	from the state highway fund all or any portion of

- 1 available moneys determined by the director of transportation to
- 2 [be in excess of] exceed one hundred thirty-five per cent of the
- 3 requirements for the ensuing twelve months for the state highway
- 4 fund as permitted by and in accordance with section 37-53. For
- 5 purposes of the determination, the director of transportation
- 6 shall take into consideration:
- 7 (1) The amount of federal funds and bond funds on deposit
- 8 in, and budgeted to be expended from, the state
- 9 highway fund during the period;
- 10 (2) Amounts on deposit in the state highway fund [which]
- 11 that are encumbered or otherwise obligated;
- 12 (3) Budgeted amounts payable from the state highway fund
- during the period;
- 14 (4) Revenues anticipated to be received by and
- expenditures to be made from the state highway fund
- during the period based on existing agreements and
- other information for the ensuing twelve months; and
- 18 (5) Any other factors as the director of transportation
- shall deem appropriate."
- 20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
