A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUN PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The legislature finds that inadequate 1 protection against the sun's harmful effects can have deadly 2 consequences. One in five Americans develops skin cancer during 3 their lifetime and fifty eight per cent of blindness worldwide 4 is cause by cataracts, which can be caused by excessive sun 5 exposure. More than one million Americans will be diagnosed 6 with skin cancer this year. That is more than all other types 7 of cancer combined. Over ten thousand Americans (more than one 8 9 per hour) will die from the disease. The three major types of skin cancer are the highly curable 10 basal cell and squamous cell carcinomas and the more seriously 11 malignant melanoma. Melanoma, the deadliest type of skin 12 cancer, is also the most rapidly increasing form of cancer in 13 the United States, causing seventy five per cent of all skin 14 cancer deaths. Skin cancer is especially prevalent in Hawaii, 15 with Kauai leading the nation in per capita incidence of basal 16

- 1 The legislature also finds that sun protection during
- 2 childhood and adolescence is particularly important because
- 3 research shows a child with a history of five or more severe
- 4 sunburns during adolescence more than doubles the child's risk
- 5 of developing melanoma. Since Hawaii is the only state situated
- 6 in the sun drenched tropics and most of Hawaii's public schools
- 7 do not have a comprehensive sun protection policy, it is
- 8 imperative that the State act expeditiously to educate and
- 9 protect public school students.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 11 education to establish and administer a sun protection program
- 12 designed to protect public school students from the harmful
- 13 effects of the sun.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:
- 17 "\$302A- Sun protection program. (a) The department
- 18 shall establish and administer a sun protection program in the
- 19 public schools to protect students against the harmful effects
- 20 of the sun.
- 21 (b) The sun protection program shall include, but not be
- 22 limited to, the following:

1	(1)	Developing a curriculum that explains the dangers of
2		sun exposure and how to best protect students against
3		the harmful effects of the sun;
4	(2)	Assessing the physical environment of all public
5		school campuses to determine the necessity of
6		increasing the number of shelters and trees to
7		adequately shade students and the school grounds;
8	<u>(3)</u>	Scheduling outdoor activities during reasonable hours
9		to protect students against excessive sun exposure;
10	(4)	Recommending the use of hats, protective clothing,
11		sunglasses, and sunscreen with a protection factor of
12		fifteen or greater to protect students against the
13		sun; and
14	(5)	Requiring regular evaluations of the sun protection
15		program by students, teachers, administrators, and
16		parents.
17	(C)	The department may adopt rules under chapter 91,
18	necessary	to effectuate the purposes of this section."
19	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
