## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUN PROTECTION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The legislature finds that inadequate 1 protection against the sun's harmful effects can have deadly 2 consequences. One in five Americans will develop skin cancer 3 4 during his or her lifetime and fifty-eight per cent of blindness 5 worldwide is caused by cataracts, which can be caused by excessive sun exposure. More than one million Americans will be 6 7 diagnosed with skin cancer this year. That is more than all 8 other types of cancer combined. Over ten thousand Americans 9 (more than one per hour) will die from the disease. 10 The three major types of skin cancer are the highly curable 11 basal cell and squamous cell carcinomas and the more serious, malignant melanoma. Melanoma, the deadliest type of skin 12 13 cancer, is also the most rapidly increasing form of cancer in 14 the United States, causing seventy-five per cent of all skin cancer deaths. Skin cancer is especially prevalent in Hawaii, 15 16 with Kauai leading the nation in per capita incidence of basal

cell carcinoma.

         The legislature also finds that sun protection during
2
    childhood and adolescence is particularly important because
3
    research shows a history of five or more severe sunburns during
4
    adolescence more than doubles a child's risk of developing
    melanoma. Since Hawaii is the only state located in the sun-

    drenched tropics and most of Hawaii's public schools do not have
7
    a comprehensive sun protection policy, it is imperative that the
8
    State act expeditiously to educate and protect public school
9
    students.

         The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
11
    education and the department of human services to establish and
12
    administer a sun protection program designed to protect public
13
    school students and children in group child care homes or care
14
    centers, such as preschools, from the harmful effects of the
15
    sun.
         SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
